# Triangles Throw

# DIFFICULTY

Easy

#### **SIZES**

One Size

#### FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Width: 44" Length: 53"

#### **MATERIALS**

<u>Universal Yarn Bella Chenille</u> (100% polyester; 100g/131 yds)

- 126 Lapis (MC) 5 skeins
- 128 Coastal (CC) 5 skeins

Needle: US Size 11 (8 mm) 32-40" circular (to accommodate large number of sts) or size needed to obtain gauge Notions: Tapestry needle, stitch markers

### GAUGE

 $13 \text{ sts} \times 14 \text{ rows} = 4$ " in Triangles patt Save time, check your gauge.

Knit, Relax, Smile, Repeat!

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#### **PATTERN NOTES**

Level up your nap game with the Triangles Throw, knit using two colors of our Bella Chenille yarn. This super plush polyester yarn has a velvet-like texture that is great for snuggling up in. A colorwork pattern of triangles makes this throw perfect for any living room or bedroom, just customize the color choices to suit your décor!

This blanket is worked using intarsia method for the border. When changing to a new color, bring the old color up and around the new color to prevent any holes from forming in the piece. Please note that there are not written instructions for the colorwork chart. Although you may use intarsia for the Triangles pattern, we recommend incorporating the stranded method for the Triangles pattern, loosely carrying floats across the back of the work. Please note that if choosing to use the stranded method for the Triangles pattern, you will still need to purl across wrong side rows. If you choose to use the intarsia method for the Triangles pattern, use a separate ball of yarn for each color change.

# PATTERN BEGINS

**THROW** 

Lower Border

With MC, cast on 143 sts.

Row 1 (RS): Knit. Row 2 (WS): Knit.

Rep Rows 1-2, 2 more times. Join CC, do not

break MC.

#### Main Throw

Set-up Row (RS): With MC k3, pm, with CC knit to last 3 sts, pm, with MC k3.

Set-up Row 2 (WS): With MC, knit to m, sl m, with CC purl to m, sl m, with MC knit to end.

Row 1: With MC knit to m, sl m, work Row 1 of Triangles patt to m, sl m, with MC knit to end. Triangles patt will be repeated 17 times across each row.

Cont in patt as est'd through Row 10 of Triangles patt, then rep Rows 1-10 of patt, 16 more times. Break CC, cont with MC only.

Upper Border Row 1 (RS): Knit. Row 2 (WS): Knit.

Rep Rows 1-2, 2 more times. Bind off all sts.

#### **FINISHING**

Gently wash and block to finished measurements. Weave in ends.


#### **Abbreviations**

CC contrast color cont continue est'd established garter st knit every row

k knitm markerMC main colorp purl

patt pattern
pm place marker
rep repeat
RS right side
sl slip
st(s) stitch(es)
WS wrong side
