Missy Raines, Royal Traveller (Compass 4715) *IBMA 2018 AWARD WINNER*

Long one of the very best, likely the best, bass players in bluegrass, Missy Raines has also explored her own, fluid, jazz and jam influenced music. She presents both on the captivating Royal Traveller, which she calls the "most personal album" of her now long career as band member and leader.



as band member and leader. Supported by a cast that includes Tim O'Brien, Molly Tuttle, Shad Cobb, and Amy Ray of the Indigo Girls, among others, she takes the listener through the full range of her music. Her own "Alleghany

Special Consensus, Rivers and Roads (Compass 4709) *IBMA ALBUM OF THE YEAR*

IBMA's Album of the Year is not a random award. Rivers and Roads contains every element you could want in a great album, including the resurrection

of John Hartford, and provides a model for how to be innovative while staying entirely within the confines of bluegrass. Thirty years ago Special Consensus was a stepping stone band for musicians; now the band is a destination.



Dave Atkins, Right or Wrong (Mountain Fever MFR180309) Dave Atkins' voice isn't high, but

certainly is lonesome, somewhat like Dave Evans. He shines brightest on medium tempo and slow burn songs that display his soulfulness best. With



Adam Steffey and Terry Baucom supporting and a mix of his own and other folks' songs, Atkins delivers a very satisfying demonstration of feeling rather than speed.

Jones Baker Gunter, Just a Memory (Patuxent CD-320)

This trio has been playing traditional bluegrass for fifty years or so, largely in the Baltimore area. That shows in this strong album of meat and potatoes bluegrass. Billy Baker fiddled and recorded with




Del McCoury back in the 1960s, while Jones – looking ever more like his father – worked with Frank Necessary, recording for Rounder. Excellent hard bluegrass from musicians who fit in between the first and second generations.

Roland White and Friends, A Tribute to the Kentucky Colonels (Mountain Home MH-1724)

Roland White doesn't get enough credit for having one of the most remarkable careers in the history of bluegrass music belonging to The Kentucky Colonels, Bill Monroe & the Blue Grass Boys, Nashville Bluegrass Band, Country Gazette, and Lester Flatt's Nashville Grass. Just a few names from the lengthy guest list on the tasty A Tribute to the Kentucky Colonels demonstrates the respect with which Roland is held

both musically and personally: Kristin Scott Benson, Brovoke & Darin Aldridge, Lindsay Lou, and Molly Tuttle. A quite lovely labor of love for all concerned that should interest most bluegrass fans.



Donna Ulisse, Breakin' Easy (Mountain Home MH16932)

Donna Ulisse found a home in bluegrass and hasn't turned back. She has earned a reputation as a strong singer and songwriter, with themes ranging from



traditional to pop. Breakin' Easy is as honest an album title as ever put on a cover, perfectly capturing her style. If you appreciate the gentler side of bluegrass, you'll love her latest.

Sister Sadie, Sister Sadie II (Pinecastle PRC1223)

Sister Sadie combines some of the finest veteran women professionals – Dale Anne Bradley, Tina Adair, Gina Britt, and Deanie Richardson. The results

on Sister Sadie II are every bit as good on you might expect. With Tina and Dale Anne forming the main vocal duo, Sister Sadie combines some of the best elements of contemporary and traditional bluegrass on a delightful outing.



Jeff Brown & Still Lonesome, A Distant Horizon (Union House Records UHR-0002)

A very good album with the former Larry Sparks' bass player taking the leading role as vocalist, songwriter, and guitar picker. Proud of his Appalachian heritage, Brown mixes pretty darn traditional bluegrass with contemporary ballads in a way reminiscent of his



friends Blue Highway. In fact, Wayne Taylor singing lead with Brown on tenor for the most hook filled and anthemic song written by Wayne and Tim Stafford, "Back When the Bluegrass Was Green."

David Davis & the Warrior River Boys, Didn't He Ramble: Songs of Charlie Poole (Rounder 00347)

David Davis & the Warrior River Boys bring to life as bluegrass music some of the best-known songs of 1920s country music (now called old-time) star banjo player and singer from North Carolina. The band does an exceptional job, putting the music in new

wineskins while maintaining the spirit of the originals. A crackerjack of an album, that reached #1 on the folk music charts even though it is a collection of old-time songs played bluegrass style. Highly recommended.



Clay Hess Band, Just Another Story (Pinecastle PRC1216)


Clay Hess has distinguished himself as a lead and rhythm guitarist, vocalist, and songwriter over the past decade. The first two of those qualities shine on the sophomore release from his eponymous band. Rather than writing material, Hess demonstrates



a wonderful facility for adapting songs from outside bluegrass sources (Jimmie Rodgers, Stan Rogers, Waylon Jennings, and Carl Perkins) into their contemporary bluegrass music.

The New Ballards Branch Bogtrotters, In the Heart of the Blue Ridge (NBBB-2017) "New" is in their name, but the Bogtrotters have been making music for 32 years. In the Heart of the Blue Ridge only reinforces

their reputation as one of the best traditionally oriented string bands around today as they carry on well into the 21st Century. Fiddler Eddie Bond is a giant of old-time fiddling who just received the National Heritage Fellowship from the NEA.



Brandon Lee Adams, Time That I Was Leavin' (Tritium **TM180324**) Despite being a top-notch Tony Rice-style guitar player for several years, Brandon Lee Adams has remained under the radar. Time That I Was



Brandon Lee Adams Leavin' brings the Kentucky native together with high caliber musicians, including Carl Jackson on back up vocals. Adams presents not just his picking, but his strong songwriting and singing.

The Churchmen, God Holds Tomorrow (Mountain Fever MFR170901) Bassman Keith Clark and I were young when The Churchmen started gaining notice. God Holds Tomorrow demonstrates why the band has endured. They don't fall into the trap of certain kinds

of arrangements of bluegrass gospel. Instead, The Churchmen perform sacred songs with an excellent variety of bluegrass music styles, just as the best bands playing secular music do.



Foghorn String Band, Rock Island Grange (FHSB-2016) Portland's Foghorn String Band long emerged as the best-known west coast old-time band, mixing a lot of high energy playing supported by a string bass in the style of the Highwoods String Band and the Freighthoppers with some slower numbers featuring



their vocals and a Louisiana French selection. Their solid, long lasting lineup keeps getting stronger with time without fundamentally changing their style. Rock Island Grange delivers everything their fans have come to love.

The Farm Hands, Good Things (Pinecastle PRC1225)

The Farm Hands' Good Things contains a good deal of good things provided by a new group of bluegrass veterans including Tim Graves, Keith Tew, and Daryl Mosely. On mostly original pieces, they cover the full

range of bluegrass music today from the slightly busy drive of "Hillbilly Graham" to the slow gospel ballad of "Thank You God," from a high speed "Dixie Breakdown" to a stately instrumental "Draining the Swamp."



Volume Five, Milestones (Mountain Fever MFR180205)



Volume Five keeps delivering what its fans expect - contemporary bluegrass performed with high quality of singing and playing. Just when they start to sound predictable, they offer a Creedence Clearwater Revival cover.

Brandon Rickman, Things Kids and Dogs Know (Voxhall **Records**) Brandon Rickman, the lead guitarist and vocalist of the Lonesome River Band, steps out on his own with the assistance of Mark Fain, Jason Carter, and Randy Kohrs, among others. As you would expect,

contains playing and singing of the highest caliber on an album consisting of traditional and traditional-inflected bluegrass except for two very contemporary ballads and gospel songs. Anyone who likes LRB will want this.



Martha Spencer, Martha Spencer (Spencer 2018)

Thorton and Emily Spencer's daughter Martha displays her own sound and lovely voice on her eponymous debut. She offers eleven acoustic honkytonk songs (her vocal display on "Ruby" owes far more to Cousin Emmy than the Osborne Brothers, for example), with one selection each of bluegrass, old-

time, and rockabilly. Martha wrote eight of the songs, while picking the other six pieces from folks ranging from Hazel Dickens to Bill Carlisle. Highly recommended for anyone who loves country music of the 1950s.



Sideline, Front and Center (Mountain Home MH17052)

With members including Steve Dilling, his son-inlaw Skip Cherryholmes, Jason Moore, and Nathan Aldridge, the founding idea that Sideline could



actually be a sideline seems foolish. This is as good as it gets contemporary bluegrass created by musicians who understand traditional bluegrass and carefully select songs that they can make their own.

Dede Wyland, Urge for Going (Patuxent CD-303)

Although she withdrew from the national scene three decades ago, Dede Wyland remains the favorite female vocalist of a lot of top level bluegrass players. That's why people like Laurie Lewis, Mike Mumford, Dudley Connell, to name just a few, back her on the bluegrass album of the year. Dede presents all the power and range (check out "Cannonball Yodel")

of her glorious voice. To imagine doing Joni Mitchell's plaintive B-side "Urge for Going" as hard driving bluegrass is remarkable; to pull it off this well is genius. Not just recommended, this is essential listening for any bluegrass fan.



Crooked Road Ramblers, Always Been A Rambler (Crooked Road Ramblers 2017)



Solid, well played Southwestern VA and Northwestern NC string band music with Kilby Spencer, John Perry, Donald Hill, Wayne Dye, Kelly Brieding and Karen Carr. Not surprising this is a great CD!

Mickey Galyean & Cullen's Bridge, Songs from the Blue Ridge (Rebel Records REB-CD 1866)

From the first note, Mickey Galyean & Cullen's Bridge demonstrate how powerful the traditional hard bluegrass of northwestern North Carolina and southwestern Virginia can be. Songs from the Blue

Ridge stands out in field filled with bluegrass. contemporary This is the real deal rendered by an experienced quartet that four grew up in the music. Must listening for those who like authentic American music.



Rhonda Vincent & The Rage with Bluegrass Legends, Live at the Ryman (UM-013-CD)

After playing four of their best-known songs, Rhonda Vincent & the Rage are joined by Sonny Osborne, rarely seen performing, and the Osborne Brothers for a half-dozen titles including "Rocky Top." Jesse McReynolds leads one song, while Mac Wiseman



makes a rare onstage appearance for four selections that could be his **BLUEGRASS** last live recordings. A most enjoyable **LEGENDS** album worth having for the Osborne Brothers and Mac's historic tracks alone.

NewTown, Old World (Mountain Home MH17202)

Built around the considerable talents of Kati Penn, NewTown is strong Kentucky band that injects a traditional feel into their contemporary bluegrass.

They do a very good job of picking material that fits their sound. Nearly a decade into its existence, New Town has channeled their energy into their best release yet.



Junior Sisk, Brand New Shade of Blue (Mountain Fever (MFR180608) Junior Sisk has established himself as



one of the foremost performers of the 21st Century version of traditional bluegrass. He delivers vet another excellent CD of hard bluegrass featuring new songs from some of today's best writers. Recommended.

Lorraine Jordan & Carolina Road, True Grass Again (Pinecastle PRC1219)


For a couple of decades, Lorraine Jordan & Carolina Road have steadily gotten better until they produced the masterful True Grass Again. The ensemble hews

so close to the classic bluegrass sound that the album goes beyond being a tribute to traditional bluegrass to true grass for real. On True Grass Again everything falls into place and clicks beautifully. Recommended.



Hog-Eyed Man, Old World Music of the Southern Appalachians (Tiki Parlor Recordings 013)

Hog-Eved Man, the duo of fiddler Jason Cade and multi-instrumentalist, augmented here by banjo player Tom Baker on most cuts, devote themselves to pre-WWII old-time music. There's no Highwoods influence here. Old World Music of the Southern Appalachians consists of 19 fiddle tunes lovingly rendered with a deep respect for tradition and a bit



of their own interpretations. The sources, such as Marcus Martin, Ed Haley, John Salyer, and Manco Sneed, for the tunes suggest what an excellent album this is. Extensive liner notes put the music in context.

Claybank, No Escape (Mountain Fever MFR-180427)

As soon as you hear Claybank sing, you know they're from North Carolina. And like so many Carolina

century, bands this their contemporary sound contains a healthy dose of traditional elements. Although No Escape is only their second album, Claybank does it quite well with top notch vocals and playing.



Johnny & Jeanette Williams, Thirty Years Later (Williams 2018) Jeanette Williams has not received the notice she deserves as a top-level vocalist, her voice gliding effortlessly above the music while capturing the meaning of the words. Although Johnny has



long been respected as a songwriter, Thirty Years Later only contains one song by each, drawing on a slew of strong writers plus a Jim Eanes cover. Musicians include some of the region's best including Jody King and Scott Freeman.
