Supply List for Kimberbell's Twilight Boolevard Bench Pillow Class



Description: Stroll along Kimberbell's **Twilight Boo-levard** to visit all of your favorite "haunts!"
Stop into Bella's Boo-tique for their grand opening, then rest a spell beneath a spooky old tree. The boo-berry pie from Broomhilda's Bakery is simply "to die for." Enjoy a slice, then pop into the Candy Corn Quilt Shoppe! With fairy lights, **Embroidery Leather**, buttons and **Mylar** and more, our Twilight Boo-levard Bench Pillow is so enchanting, it's almost scary.

Learn how to:

- In the hoop applique
- Machine embroidery
- Embellish with leather, glitter, vinyl, mylar, twinkle lights and more
- Piece your pillow top
- Quilt in the hoop using IQ
 Designer/Design Center and quilt using tradition embroidery patterns
- Complete the pillow construction on a Baby Lock Serger

Supplies needed for embroidery:

- Your machine with embroidery arm and embroidery foot attached.
- Kimberbell's Twilight Boo-levard embroidery pattern and embellishment kit
- Design preloaded on a USB Flash Drive
- FABRIC, precut AS PER THE PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS. After you

- cut your pieces, label and group them according to each embroidery design. A little upfront work will save you time as we embroider.
- 1 yard of Pellon ShapeFlex 101
 (available at A1). PLEASE fuse to all your <u>Background</u> pieces.
- Iron small enough to press projects in the 5" x 7" hoop and a wool mat (optional but highly recommended)
- Best press
- Teflon pressing Sheet. I use the Goddess Teflon Sheet
- Seam Ripper
- Roll of Tearaway stabilizer to fit your hoops. We'll be doing several hoopings
- 5" x 7" hoop or comparable
- Kimberbell Orange Rectangle Pop Rulers set. We will be using the 4 ½" x 6 ½" and 6 ½" x 8 ½". These are not required but highly recommended. Otherwise you need a square ruler at least 9.5" x 9.5"
- Small ruler like a 4 ½" x 12 ½"
- I used a rotary cutter and an Olfa 12"x12" rotating cutting mat to square up my pieces. Highly recommended. But you can just bring a regular cutting mat that is 12" x 18" or smaller
- Madeira Anti-glue 75/11 or 80/12
 Microtex needles
- Water soluble pen or Frixion pen optional
- Spray Adhesive (I prefer Gunold KK100) and or Kimberbell Tape and or Transpore tape
- Tweezers
- Scissors, snips, applique scissors. My favorite are double curved applique scissors and Famore Snips.
- Embroidery thread in coordinating colors
- Prewound bobbins with machine embroidery bobbin thread in white and black
- Sidehoppers for trimming jump threads (optional)

Supplies needed for the piecing and sewing your embellishments

- Sewing machine with 1/4" foot
- Iron and wool mat
- Best Press
- 80/12 Micotex needle
- I piece with Wonderfil Decobob
- Matching bobbin
- Hand sewing needle
- Corner turner
- Glue gun (optional)
- Baby Lock/Brother orange handle eyelet punch
- Fairy lights

Modifications to embellishments:

- I cut down the "Boo" pillow that goes on the bench. A friend said the pillow overwhelmed the bench and I had to agree. I cut off the flower and the Oct 31 part of the pillow and found it was a much better size. This is of course optional.
- I also made an envelope back for both the quilt and the pillow in the embellishment kit so that I didn't have to hand sew them closed. For the quilt back I cut (2) 2 ½" x 3 ½" and for the pillow back I cut (2) 2 ½" x 2 ¾".

Supplies needed for Quilting in IQ Designer or Design Center

 Quilt top should be sandwiched with batting and backing. Batting and backing should be at least 3-6 inches wider on all sides than the quilt top. So if your top is 31" x 30", batting and backing should be at least 37" x 36". Have your quilt layered and ready to go

If you are on a Destiny, Dream Machine, Solaris or Luminaire, you will need:

 Capacitive stylus of your choice for the Solaris or Luminaire. Make sure it is charged before class

- Stylus that came with the machine if you're on the Destiny, Dream Machine, Altair, Meridian or Stellaire.
- USB with embroidery designs on them
- Corded Mouse and mouse pad (lots of people prefer using the mouse over the styluses)
- Tweezers
- Snips
- Thread of your choice for quilting. I used DecoBob in off-white and embroidery thread in black
- Extra bobbins
- 90/14 or 80/12 Microtex needle or Quilting Needle
- Roll of blue painter's tape
- Quilting in the hoop is easiest with a Snap Hoop. You could use either a 9.5" x 14" or a 10.5" x 16". You can also use the hoops that came with your machine. If you use a traditional hoop, I recommend also using Nancy Zieman's double sided basting tape to hold your inner frame in place when you are hooping.
- I also used one of the Boo free-motion quilting designs from Anita Goodesign's Freemotion Frenzy Design Book. A perfect alternative would be Kimberbell's Halloween borders. Click here for the borders.

For the pillow construction on the serger with custom piping:

- A Baby Lock serger
- 5mm Cording foot
- 4 cones of serger thread in color to match your piping fabric
- 120" strip of fabric, 1 ½" wide. This can be cut width of fabric. Does not have to be cut on the bias.
- You'll also need 120" of 5/32" cording. We carry this at the store.
- Backing fabric cut (2) 10" x 17" and (1) 28" x 17"

- Wonder clips
- Strong tipped scissors
- We will also do some topstitching on the sewing machine
