

Methods For Printing Image Files On Cloth

There are several techniques you can use to transfer the image file onto your fabric, listed below. Four different methods are listed below in order of preference. You may choose the method you prefer or are familiar with. Number four is if you want to add text to your quilt block. This step is optional.

Before attempting any of the listed inkjet printing techniques on your final fabric block, it is **highly recommended** that you run a test print on paper to confirm the image placement and size.

METHOD #1:

INKJET: FREEZER PAPER PRINTING
- RECOMMENDED -

This method is very economical because it allows you to print on your own fabric. All that is required is some freezer paper. Let us know if you have questions regarding this method.

METHOD #3:

INKJET: IRON-ON TRANSFER PAPER

Iron-on heat transfer papers from:

- Avery
- A-Sub
- Handy Crafts

Ensure that you have an appropriate transfer paper for your fabric – different types are required for light or dark fabrics.

METHOD #2:

INKJET: PRINTABLE FABRIC SHEETS

Manufacturers that specialize in producing inkjet-printable cloth sheets include:

- Jacquard
- Printed Treasures
- Avery

We recommend following the manufacturer's printing directions.

METHOD #4 - OPTIONAL:

FABRIC MARKERS AND PENS
- TO ADD TEXT ONTO FABRIC -

Utilize this method if you would prefer to hand-letter text onto your own fabric.

Quality fabric pen manufacturers include:

- Tuskinoko Fabrico
- Tulip
- Coloré Premium

We recommend testing the markers on a scrap of fabric before using on your block.
