Apricot Yarn & Supply

Cabin Beanie

Materials

Yarn: Madelinetosh A.S.A.P, one skein or 90 yards super bulky yarn

Needles: US 10.5 and US 11, 16" circular needles and US 11 double pointed needles

Gauge: 3 sts per inch

Other: ring marker

Finished measurements: Baby 16", Child 18", Adult S 20", Adult L 22"

How to make:

With size 10.5 needles, loosely cast on **48**, 54, **60**, 66 sts using the long tail cast on. Add BOR and join for knitting in the round.

Round 1: (K1, P1), repeat this pattern around to the end of the round. Round 2-5: Repeat Round 1.

(You can choose to make the ribbing longer if you prefer. With the yarn given you can add 3-4 more rows of ribbing.)

Round 7: Change to US 11 needles and knit every stitch.

Round 8: Knit

Repeat Round 8 until the hat measures **4"**, 5, **7"**, 7" from the cast on.

Decreases:

When working decreases, transfer to double pointed needles when the hat no longer fits around the circular needle and is too tight.

Round 1: (K4, k2tog), repeat this () until the end of the round.

Round 2: Knit

Round 3: (Knit 3, k2tog), repeat this () until the end of the round.

Round 4: Knit

Round 5: (Knit 2, k2tog), repeat this ()until the end of the round.

Round 6: Knit

Round 7: (Knit 1, k2tog), repeat this ()until the end of the round.

Round 8: (K2tog), repeat this ()until the end of the round.

Cut a long tail. Add the yarn to a tapestry needle and weave the yarn through the remaining stitches on the needle. Remove the stitches from the knitting needle as you add the onto the yarn with the tapestry needle.

Once all the remaining stitches are on the yarn, pull the yarn to close the hole at the top of the hat. Secure the yarn, keeping the yarn tight so the hole stays closed. Weave in the tail on the inside of the hat under several stitches. Cut remaining yarn.

Add a pom pom or style it as you wish.
