



Simple Fingerless Mitts

Yarn: 95 yards worsted weight yarn

Ewe Ewe Woolly Worsted - 1 ball

Needles: US 8

Other tools: Tapestry Needle

Size: Each glove measures 3 inches wide by 6 inches long. This pattern makes two fingerless mitts.

How to make

Cast on 25 stitches using knitted cast on or long tail cast on, leaving a long tail of yarn (10 inches) that can be used for sewing when finishing the mitts.

Knit every row until piece measures 6 inches.

Bind off all stitches.

Cut yarn leaving a long tail for sewing.

You should have a square that measures 6 inches by 6 inches with a long tail on each end.

Sewing the mitt closed:

Fold the square in half lining up the cast on edge and the bind off edge. With one tail sew down from the top edge about 1.5 inches, using the whip stitch. Secure and weave in ends. With other tail, sew up from bottom of square about 3 inches using the whip stitch. Be sure to leave a space open for your thumb to fit through. Secure and weave in ends. Cut tails, if needed.

Repeat all steps to make second mitt.
