



PIXIE SPLAT

Weights & Measures

Splat shape 2.7g bright yellow

Skirt detail 0.2g leaf green

Arms and Legs 0.4g (approx 0.1g

each limb)

Dougie decor boot 0.2g marigold

In addition you will need fibre or curls for the hair, something to make wings out of (I used hotfix angelina fibres) but Mum's Makery also has Pixie Wings!

2 x 30cm pipe cleaners and fluff to wrap the arms and legs with. I also used felters wax to smooth the wrapped arms & legs.

Don't forget the superglue gel as well!



Fill the template with 2.7g of bright yellow. I fill the edges first and move towards the centre.

I find making rolls out of small sections of fluff helps me fill the shapes of the template nicely. It gives me a tidier edge.

Stab evenly all over, checking for thinner sections by holding up to the light & regularly lifting off the mat so it doesn't stick.

Work on one side only, this means the side facing the mat has a lovely smooth finish. Keep felting, using a multi tool if you have one, until the shape is nice and firm.



Trim any stray fibres from the edge of the shape.

Divide your 0.2g leaf green into five equal sections. Twist one end of each section into a point.

Lay in the centre of the splat like a star shape and felt the central section firmly. Leave the pointy ends unfixed. Cut 4 10cm sections of pipe cleaner. For the arms- wrap each arm with 0.1g flesh tone.

Start near one end of the pipe cleaner, about 2cm in. Using a thin section of fluff, hold one end on the pipe cleaner and wrap toward the end firmly.

When you are nearly at the end, fold the tip of the pipecleaner over to make the hand.

Continue wrapping, cover the hand and approximately 5 cm to make the arm. Repeat for the other arm.

For the legs- wrap a 5cm length in the colour of your choice but you keep the pipe cleaner straight.

You don't need to fold a section over for the legs. I chose to do black legs with a thin twisted strand of yellow wrapped round to give it detail. 0.2g should wrap 2 legs.

I used warm felters wax to help keep the arms nice and smooth and to hold any loose fibres in place





Make a pair of pixie boots from the Dougie Decor set. Glue them onto the bottom of the legs, covering the join with extra fluff for a tidy finish.

Felt carefully so you don't push the fibres through to the right side.

Make your wings. I make mine from sheets of hotfix angelina fibre but you could also cut them from fabric, felt them or even use the pixie wings from our shop!

Decide where you want the arms and the legs to be and twist them together.

Glue the twisted section into place on the underside of the splat and cover with more fluff to help keep it in place. Be careful not to push the fibres through to the right side.

Turn the splat over and add your final details. Glue the wings into place in the centre or felt them in place using extra fibre.

Use locks, curls or some fibre for the hair. Arrange the arms and legs to give maximum splat effect!
