



2.5D Turkey

You will need a felting surface and a needle, my favourite is the Mum's Makery flatmat and my go to needle is the 40 spiral.

A set of pocket scales, a 38 spiral needle and a pair of sharp scissors will also be handy too.

Materials Used

Warm Brown 4.3 grams

Cranberry 0.35 grams

White 0.2 grams

Marigold 0.15 grams

Black Pinch of

Weights & Size are approx.



For this project I have chosen to use Warm Brown.

So with 2 grams of Warm Brown I start with the tail fan template.



Using small amounts from the 2 grams I start to fill the template.

Fold the small pieces over and place them into each section, felt these sections then use the rest to fill the remainder of the template.



Felt it firmly all over remembering to turn your work over regularly so that it doesn't stick to your felting surface.

Set this to one side.

Next is the head, body and wings template.

I have used 1 gram of Warm Brown for this.



Again I take small amounts and fill the small bits first.

This is to make sure that the wool reaches the very tips of the templates.

When you have done that use the rest of the wool to finish the template.





Here is the finished shape now set it to one side.

This again has been firmly felted on both sides.



Next is the wattle and I have used 0.3 grams of Cranberry for this.

Same again, use a small amount to fill the narrow bit at the bottom then fill the template with the rest of the wool.





Now set this aside with the other parts.



Here are all the turkey parts we have done so far.



This is how we will stack them when we have made them more 2.5D.

Take the tail shape and add a pillow of 0.5 grams of Warm Brown.

This will need to be circular and placed bottom center.





Felt this firmly into a circular shape around the same size as the body shape.



To decorate the tail feathers I have used 0.05 grams of Cranberry and 0.05 grams of Marigold.

Take a pinch of each colour and roll each one between your finger and thumb.

This will make a neat strand that will be easier to felt in a straight line.



I have repeated this pattern on each feather.

Now with my 38 spiral needle I have marked out a line between each feather.





This makes it look like there are individual feathers.



Now for the body.

Just on the lower part of the body shape add 0.4grams.

This is rolled up into a pillow and felted onto the shape.



Felt it firmly to the body.

This is a side view to show how plump his belly is.

If you want him fatter then just add more wool.

For his head use another 0.4 grams of wool, again rolled up into a pillow.

Felt exactly the same as the body pillow.





Again another side view to show the depth.



For his eyes you will need 2 x 0.1 grams of White wool.

Roll each one up and felt in place.



Place them onto the Cranberry wattle to check that they are a good size.

For his beak I have used 0.1 gram of Marigold.







Then turn it around and felt the fluffy bottom into another triangle shape so now we have a diamond.



I have trimmed this up with a pair of sharp scissors.



When we put it on the face we will bend it over so now it looks more like a beak.

Back to the eyes.

With two pinches of Black felt a little dot in the center of the White balls.



Place the eyes towards the top and the beak under the eyes.

Felt these in place.





Work all the way around each shape making sure that they are firmly attached.



Now attach that to the head.

I have put mine as high up as I could to the top of his head.

With the head and the body completed it's time to attach that to the body.





Line up the two parts at the bottom and start to attach them together.



Use your needle all over the body to make sure that the two parts are firmly joined.



There you have your finished turkey.

You could attach a magnet or brooch fitting on the back.





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
