- 1. Choose the beads you would like to use.
- 2. Use the beads naturally or paint them. Two coats is best. Allow paint to dry before the next step. We used skewers and toothpicks to help with this step.
- 3. Tie the cord onto the end of the chain and start threading.
- 4. Don't forget to tie a good sized knot on the end to finish up!

Coloured Beads










- 1. Choose the beads you would like to use.
- 2. There's lots of fun choosing different colours and shapes to be had.
- 3. Tie the cord onto the end of the chain and start threading.
- 4. Don't forget to tie a good sized knot on the end to finish up!

If the holes of the beads are a bit blocked due to imperfections, take a toothpick and push it through. If the cord end becomes frayed, either trim it a little, or dampen the end to bring it together. Have fun experimenting with different colours, patterns and ways of threading the beads!
