



5 Letter Writing Tips from a Tooth Fairy

1. Remember, Tooth Fairies are really very small. Our handwriting is tiny (5 points) and we love to use colored ink with sparkles. Hold The Magic offers a beautiful little magnifying glass (we call it a “Bigger”) to help children read our tiny fairy writing.
2. We love to play with fancy lettering styles. Sometimes it’s hard to remember which style we used for each child’s last tooth. Children can be very clever when comparing each lost tooth letter, so we like to be consistent.
3. We also use fanciful language. Remember, we live in a magical world where we play with woodland creatures and bug friends. Fairyland is a place where fairies make magic, add color to flower blossoms, knit dandelion slippers, and play with unicorns in vibrant rainbows! Each tiny magical letter is an opportunity to inspire creativity in a child’s mind. We never take that for granted.
4. If a child has given us a name or requested a specific gender of fairy, it’s our job to make sure to remember to sign each letter with the same name. We enjoy hearing parents ask a child what they believe their fairy will be like.
5. When we’re feeling especially creative, we love to craft a little rhyming poem! Fairies love to play with words, sing, rhyme, and dance!
