| Product | Species | Directions for use or as suggested by a veterinarian |

| 200 Teapill | canine, feline | 1-2 pills per 10 lbs bw; bid |
| RegularPowder200 g or 600 g | canine, feline | 0.5 g per 10 to 20 lbs bw; bid |
|  | equine | 10 |
| $\begin{gathered} \text { Concentrated } \\ 90 \mathrm{~g} \end{gathered}$ | canine, feline | $1 / 2$ to 1 small scoop per 10 to 20 lbs bw; bid |
|  | equine | 2½ large scoops (3g); bid |
| Conc. Capsule $100-0.5 \mathrm{~g}$ | canine, feline | 1 capsule per 20 to 40 lbs bw; bid |
| Conc. Capsule $50-0.2 \mathrm{~g}$ | canine, feline | 1 capsule for small dog/cat<10 lbs; sid |
| Conc. 7500mg Tincture | canine, feline | 10 drops per 5 to 10 lbs bw, bid |

$\mathrm{lb}=$ pound; $\mathrm{bw}=$ body weight; bid=twice daily; sid=once daily
