When you watch advertisements you will see hundreds for the body: food, clothes, medicines, sport, etc. You will also see hundreds for the mind: concerts, plays, books, educational programmes, etc. But I have never seen an advertisement for the spirit. Why not?

Because the reason for an advertisement is to make money, and the things that



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God gives to our spirits are all free. When we ask, he gives us forgiveness, peace, courage, the knowledge of his love and he also gives us eternal life. None of these things can be bought with money. So, prayer is your spirit communicating with God. It is asking him for what he longs to give. It is thanking him and telling him about our needs and the needs of those we love.

Perhaps you are not quite sure that there is a God who listens when you pray. If so, and if you really want to know him, you can pray like this: 'Oh God, I want to know you. If you are there, please make yourself real to me, or give me some sign.'

God does not always answer at once, but if you keep on patiently praying like that, he will answer you in his own time. If a child is lost and trying to find his way home, you may be quite sure that his father and mother are also searching for him, because they love him. So if you are searching for God, you may be sure that the God who loves you is also searching for you.
