

The catechism is "fat." It's bursting at the seams with meaning, challenge, and comfort. It's concise, but it's also deep. Most importantly, it should be familiar.





To Parents

At the same time the art must be faithful to the words our God has spoken to us. To avoid slipping into speculation, God's word was set as the center and boundary of this book's art. As the psalmist says, "In your light we see light" (Psalm 36:9).

Our hope is that these images might spark your biblical imagination as you pray the words of the Lord's Prayer. At points, listening to the church's saints—for example, Martin Luther in his Small Catechism—stirred up our own biblical imaginations. No doubt, you too will be encouraged and challenged by what the church's great cloud of witnesses has said about the Lord's Prayer!
