Rules and Instagram Video Format



One team member must have a "public" Instagram Account to participate, and the same account should be used every upload. Maybe use one phone for every video?

You can even make a new account with your actual team's name, just for this tournament if you prefer.

The rules are pretty basic. Follow all the fishing laws and stay out of National Recreation areas and National Parks (even if there is an open-season we cannot operate a tournament on these waters).

Summary:

- Water can be private or public.
- Fly fishing only.
- Fishing is 5 am 2 pm (all submissions due by 2 pm)
- Provided "Control Bracelet" MUST be visible in all submissions.
- Teams must stay together within a direct line of site (no self-filming your catch).
- Big Fish entries, must use a Measure Net for official entry.
- Canals and Wasteways are considered "creeks".

Videos:

- 10-20 second videos are best! Practice trimming videos before the day of the event. Shorter videos upload faster using Instagram Reels you can even splice videos together.
- VERTICAL filming, (portrait style) is required.
- Videos as "reel" as long and you need to tag @redsflyshop
- You must state your Team Name, species, and show off the control bracelet.
- Get the sun behind you, camera low, celebrate the catch and make it fun to watch!

WaterMaster Competition

- Wade fishing only, angler must say on video "I want a WaterMaster so Bad".
- Must tag both @redsflyshop and @watermaster1 in the video
- Video may be use for both WaterMaster comp and a species as long as you check all the boxes.
- Everyone entered will be put into a drawing at the closing ceremony!
