

### **Additional Requirements**

- 80" x 90" (203.20cm x 228.60cm) batting
- 100% cotton thread in a color to match
- Rotary cutter, ruler, and mat
- Basic sewing and pressing supplies

#### Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric LOF = Length of Fabric

#### Fabric A, cut:

(2) 4" (13.97cm) x WOF (9) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (6.35cm) x WOF, for binding

#### Fabric B, cut:

(1)  $6\frac{1}{4}$ " (15.88cm) x WOF; subcut (4)  $6\frac{1}{4}$ " (15.88cm) squares then cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 16 triangles (4) 5" (12.7cm) x WOF; sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 5" x  $72\frac{1}{2}$ " (12.7cm x 184.15cm) borders (3) 4" (13.97cm) x WOF (2) 4" (10.16cm) x WOF; subcut (16) 4" (10.16cm) squares (4) 3" (7.62cm) x WOF; sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 3" x  $73\frac{1}{2}$ " (7.62cm x 186.69cm) borders

#### Fabric C, cut:

(2) 3" (7.62cm) x WOF (4)  $2^{1}/_{2}$ " x WOF; subcut (2)  $2^{1}/_{2}$ " x  $24^{1}/_{2}$ " (6.35cm x 62.23cm) and (2)  $2^{1}/_{2}$ " x  $28^{1}/_{2}$ " (6.35cm x 72.39cm) borders

#### Fabric D, cut:

(3) 6" (15.24cm) x WOF; subcut (8) 6" x 12½" (15.24cm x 31.75cm)

#### Fabric E, cut:

(3) 6" (15.24cm) x WOF; subcut (8) 6" x 12<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"
(15.24cm x 31.75cm) rectangles
(3) 3" (7.62cm) x WOF; sewn together end to end cut into (2) 3" x 55<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (7.62cm x 140.97cm) borders

(3) 2" (5.08cm) x WOF; sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 2" x  $52^{1}/_{2}$ " (5.08cm x 133.35cm) borders

### Fabric F, cut:

(1)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " (31.75cm) x WOF; subcut (4)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " (16.51cm x 31.75cm) and (1)  $11\frac{1}{4}$ " (28.58cm) square cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 4 triangles. (1)  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " (19.05cm) x WOF; subcut (4)  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " (10.05cm) x WOF; subcut (4)  $7\frac{1}{2}$ "

(19.05cm) squares (2) 3" (7.62cm) x WOF

#### Fabric G, cut:

(1)  $57^1\!\!/_{2}$  " x WOF (146.05cm x WOF), subcut (2)  $6^1\!\!/_{2}$  " x  $57^1\!\!/_{2}$  " (16.51cm x 146.05cm) borders cut LOF

(4)  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " (21.59cm) x WOF; sewn together end to end and cut into (2)  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $67\frac{1}{2}$ " (21.59cm x 171.45cm) borders

### Sewing

**Note:** Use a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" (.64cm) seam allowance throughout. Sew all pieces with right sides together and raw edges even using matching thread.

## **Block Assembly**

#### Block 1

 From Fabrics C and F 3" (7.62cm) x WOF strips, cut 16 diamonds each Small Star Template. Diagram 1

 Sew C and F small diamonds together in pairs as shown. Do not backstitch. Press seams open. Make 16 sets of diamond pairs. Diagram 2




3. Using a set-in seam, sew a Fabric B 4" (10.16cm) square in the "V" where the Fabrics C and F diamonds meet in a diamond set. To accomplish a set-in seam, start by picking out a couple stitches in the "V" where the diamonds meet. Right sides together, sew one side of the B square to the edge of the C diamond. Remove the fabric from under the sewing machine



and fold it so the adjoining edge of the B square is aligned with the F diamond, right sides together. Stitch together. Press seams away from B fabric. Repeat to make 16 star corners. **Diagram 3**

Referring to diagram, arrange the 4 star corner units in two rows. Sew into rows. Sew rows together. Press seams open. Add the 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" (15.88cm) Fabric B triangles with set-in seams. Press seams away from B fabric. Make a total of 4 Block 1, 12<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (31.75cm) square unfinished. Diagram 4



#### Block 2


 Sew 2 Fabric A and 3 Fabric B 4" (10.16cm) x WOF strips together lengthwise, alternating fabrics. Diagram 5





 Using the Large Star Template, cut 8 twotone diamonds for star points with the heavy black line on the template even with the seams between Fabrics A and B. Diagram 6

 Sew 2 Fabric A/B diamonds together in a pair as shown. Do not backstitch. Press seams open. Make 4 sets of diamond pairs. Diagram 7



8. Referring to Steps 2-4, make 1 Block 2 [24<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (62.23cm) square unfinished] with Fabric A/B large star points, Fabric F 11<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" (28.56cm) triangles and 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (19.05cm) squares. Diagram 8

9. Arrange 1 Fabric F 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 12<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (16.51cm x 31.75cm) and two each Fabrics D and E 6" x 12<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (15.24cm x 31.75cm) rectangles in a row as shown. Sew together along their long edges. Make a total of 4 of Block 3, each 12<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 28<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (31.75cm x 72.39cm) unfinished. Diagram 9

## Quilt Top Assembly

Refer to **Quilt Layout** on page 6 for the following steps.

- **10.** Sew **Fabric C** (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $24\frac{1}{2}$ " (6.35cm x 62.23cm) borders right and left sides of Block 2. Add **Fabric C**  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $28\frac{1}{2}$ " (6.35cm x 72.39cm) borders to top and bottom of Block 2.
- 11. Arrange bordered Block 2, 4 of Block
  1, and 4 of Block 3 in 3 rows. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together to complete quilt center, 52<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (133.35cm) square unfinished.
- 12. Sew Fabric E 2" x 52½" (5.08cm x 133.35cm) borders to the right and left sides of the quilt center. Add Fabric E 3" x 55½" (7.62cm x 140.97cm) borders to top and bottom center.
- 13. Sew Fabric G 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 57<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (16.51cm x 146.05cm) borders to the right and left sides of the quilt. Add Fabric G 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 67<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (21.59cm x 171.45cm) borders to top and bottom.

14. Sew Fabric B 3" x 73<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (7.62cm x 186.69m) borders to the right and left sides of thequilt. Add Fabric B 5" x 72<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (12.7cm x 184.15cm) borders to top and bottom.

## Finishing


- **15.** Cut and piece the backing to match the batting, 80" x 90" (202.20cm x 228.60cm). Layer the backing right side down, batting, and quilt top right side up. Quilt or tie as desired.
- 16. Prepare binding from (9) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF (6.35cm x WOF) Fabric A strips. Sew strips together into one long binding strip. Press strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together.
- **17.** Carefully trim backing and batting even with quilt top.
- 18. Leaving an 8" (20.32cm) tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" (30.48cm) from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" (.64cm) and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
- **19.** Turn binding to back of quilt and blind stitch in place.

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


This square should measure 1" x 1" (2.54cm x 2.54cm) when printed.
