Meadowview, a quilt featuring the Thameside Collection, was inspired by the sights and sounds of a meadow. Fussy cut squares from the iconic Strawberry Thief prints are the star of the show, and lend to the meadow theme. Simple to piece stars offered in two colorways give this quilt a traditional touch.

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## Cutting

## Fabric A, cut:

Fussy cut (6) $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares on point. Reference the cover image when fussy cutting. Center the bird motifs in the $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ on point squares.

## Fabric B, cut:

Fussy cut (12) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2$ " squares on point. Reference the cover image when fussy cutting. Center the bird motifs in the $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " on point squares.

## Fabric C, cut:

(2) $18 \frac{1}{4}$ " $\times$ WOF; sub-cut
(3) $181 / 4$ " squares and (2) $91 / 2$ " squares

Fabric D, cut:
(5) 2 " x WOF; sub-cut
(96) $2^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## Fabric E, cut:

(9) $31 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for borders
(4) 2 " $\times$ WOF; sub-cut
(24) $2^{\prime \prime}$ squares and (24) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2 "$ rectangles
(5) $3 ½$ " $\times$ WOF; sub-cut
(48) $31 / 2$ " squares

## Fabric F , cut:

(7) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ LENGTH of fabric strips centering the vine motif within each strip; sub-cut
(48) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles centering the vine motif

## Fabric G, cut:

(8) $11 / 2^{" 1} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(12) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles and
(12) $1 \frac{112}{}{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
(13) $31 / 21 \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(48) $31 / 2$ " squares and
(48) $31 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{" 1}$ rectangles

## Fabric H, cut:

(4) 2" x WOF; sub-cut
(24) 2" squares and
(24) 2 " $\times 31 / 2$ " rectangles
(5) $31 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF; sub-cut
(48) $31 / 2$ " squares

## Fabric I, cut:

(9) $2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for binding
(3) $31 / 22^{1 "} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(31) $31 / 2$ " squares

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## Sewing

Note: all seam allowances are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}(.64 \mathrm{~cm})$ unless otherwise noted Sew pieces right sides together.

1. Cut all $181 / 4$ " Fabric $C$ squares twice diagonally to make quarter-square triangles or QST (Fig. 1).

2. Cut all $9 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{C}$ squares once diagonally to make half-square triangles or HST (Fig. 2).

3. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 10 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ rectangle to either side of (6) $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A squares (Fig. 3). Press toward Fabric G. Then sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ x $121 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ rectangle to the remaining sides of each Fabric A square (Fig. 3). Once complete, blocks should measure $12^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ unfinished (Fig. 3).

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4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (96) 2" Fabric $\mathbf{D}$ squares (Fig. 4).

5. Place (1) $2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{D}$ square with a drawn diagonal line on one side of (1) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2$ " Fabric E rectangle, RST. Sew along the drawn diagonal line. Trim excess corner fabric to a $1 / 4^{"}$ and press toward the corner. Repeat to attach (1) 2" Fabric D square to the remaining side of the Fabric E rectangle to complete (1) flying geese unit measuring 2 " $\times$ $31 / 2$ " unfinished (Fig. 5).

6. Repeat flying geese unit assembly described in Step 5 to create (24) units using Fabrics D and E, and (24) units using Fabrics D and H (Fig. 6).

 Fabric B square. Arrange to form a small star for the center of a block (Fig. 7). Sew the small star together, pressing seams away from the flying geese units. Once complete, the small star should measure $61 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ $\times 6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ unfinished (Fig. 7).

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8. Repeat to create (6) small stars using Fabrics B, D and E and (6) small stars using Fabrics B, D and H (Fig. 8).

9. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (48) $31 / 2$ " Fabric E squares and (48) $3 ½$ " Fabric H squares (Fig. 9).

10. Repeat assembly described in Step 5 to create (24) flying geese units using $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E squares and (24) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric G rectangles (Fig. 10). Repeat to create (24) additional flying geese units using 3½" Fabric H squares and $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric G rectangles (Fig. 10). Flying geese units should measure $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ unfinished.

11. Gather (1) small star (Fabrics B, D and E), (4) E/G flying geese units and (4) $3 ½ "$ Fabric G squares. Arrange for form a block (Fig. 11). Sew the block together, pressing seams away from the flying geese units. Once complete, the block should measure $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ unfinished (Fig. 11).

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12. Repeat to create (6) blocks using Fabric $\mathbf{E}$ as the focal fabric, and (6) blocks using Fabric H as the focal fabric (Fig. 12).

## Top Assembly

13. Arrange blocks in a $3 \times 4$ diagonal grid. Use $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric $F$ rectangles as sashing and $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric I square as cornerstones. Use 181/4" Fabric C OST as side setting triangles and $91 / 2$ " Fabric C HST as corner setting triangles (Fig. 13).
14. Sew the diagonal block rows together, pressing toward the Fabric F sashing rectangles (Fig. 13). Sew the diagonal sashing rows of varying lengths together, pressing toward the Fabric F sashing rectangles (Fig. 13).

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15. Sew diagonal block and sashing rows together. Trim excess cornerstone fabric from the sides of the quilt top so that the quilt top has a straight edge. When trimming, be sure to include $a^{1 / 4} 4^{4}$ seam allowance.
16. Sew (9) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric E strips together for length using diagonal seams.
17. Measure the height of the quilt top through the center and along the sides. Average the measurements. Trim (2) $31 / 2{ }^{2}$ wide Fabric E side border strips using the quilt's actual measurements. Attach Fabric E side borders (Fig. 14). Press outward.
18. With side borders attached, measure the width of the quilt top through the center and along the top and bottom. Average the measurements. Trim (2) $31 / 2^{" 1}$ wide Fabric $\mathbf{E}$ top/bottom border strips using the quilt's actual measurements. Attach Fabric E top/bottom borders (Fig. 14). Press outward to complete quilt top assembly.

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## Finishing

19. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and quilt top (right side up). Baste quilt layers together and quilt as desired.
20. Sew together the (9) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric I binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
21. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the quilt.
22. Leaving an 8 " tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
23. Turn binding to back of quilt and hand stitch in place.
