Fabric A, cut:
(1) $18 \frac{1}{4^{\prime \prime}} \times$ WOF ( $46.36 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (2) $1814^{\prime \prime}$
$(46.36 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares and (4) $31 / 2(8.89 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares
(1) $93 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $23.81 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (2) $93 / 8^{\prime \prime}$
( 23.81 cm ) squares and (1) $71 / 4^{\prime \prime}(18.42 \mathrm{~cm})$ square
(3) $71 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $18.42 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (15) $71 / 4^{\prime \prime}$
( 18.42 cm ) squares
(5) $3112^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $8.89 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (60) $3112(8.89 \mathrm{~cm}$ ) squares

## Fabric B, cut:

(1) $181 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $46.36 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (2) $181 / 4^{\prime \prime}$
( 46.36 cm ) squares
(4) $71 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $18.42 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (16) $714^{n}$
$(18.42 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares and ( 16 ) $31 / 2(8.89 \mathrm{~cm}$ ) squares
(4) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $8.89 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (48) $31 / 2(8.89 \mathrm{~cm}$ ) squares

## Fabric C, cut:

(1) 6 ¹⁄2" $\times$ WOF ( $16.51 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (4) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$(16.51 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares
(2) $3^{7} 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $9.84 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (16) $378^{\prime \prime}(9.84 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares

## Fabric D, cut:

(2) $61 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $16.51 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (12) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$(16.51 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares
(5) $3^{7} 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $9.84 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (48) $3^{7} / 8^{\prime \prime}(9.84 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares

## Fabric E, cut:

(2) $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $16.51 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (8) $6{ }^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$
( 16.51 cm ) squares and (2) $37 / 8^{\prime \prime}(9.84 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares
(3) $3^{7} / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $9.84 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (30) $3^{7} 8^{\prime \prime}(9.84 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares

## Fabric F, cut:

(1) $6^{1} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $16.51 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (4) $6^{1 \frac{1}{2}}$ ( 16.51 cm ) squares

## Fabric G, cut:

(2) $3^{7} / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $9.84 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (16) $3^{7} / 8^{\prime \prime}(9.84 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares
(9) $2 \frac{1}{1 / 2} \times$ WOF $(6.35 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF $)$, for binding

## Fabric H, cut:

(1) $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $16.51 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (4) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$(16.51 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares
(2) $378^{7 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $9.84 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF); sub-cut (16) $378^{\prime \prime}$ ( 9.84 cm ) squares

## Fabric I, cut:

(9) $3^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $8.89 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF), for border

## Sewing

All seam allowances are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}(.64 \mathrm{~cm})$ and pieces are sewn right sides together. Note that you'll have some extra pieces leftover for another project.

1. Cut all $1814^{\prime \prime}(46.36 \mathrm{~cm})$ and $71 / 4^{\prime \prime}(18.42 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares twice diagonally to make quarter-square triangles (QST) (Fig. 1)

2. Cut all $93 / 8^{\prime \prime}(23.81 \mathrm{~cm})$ and $37 / 8^{\prime \prime}(9.84 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares once diagonally to make half-square triangles (HST) (Fig. 2).

## Constellations

3. Sew (2) $3^{7} / 8^{\prime \prime}(9.84 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric C HST to each side of a $71 / 4^{\prime \prime}(18.42 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric A OST as shown. Make a total of (16) Unit 1 (Fig. 3).

4. In the same manner, make (48) Unit 2, (32) Unit 3, (16) Unit 4, and (16) Unit 5 with the fabrics indicated (Fig. 4).

5. Arrange (4) Unit $1,(1) 6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}(16.51 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric $\mathbf{C}$ square, and (4) $3 ½$ ( 8.89 cm ) Fabric $\mathbf{A}$ squares in (3) rows as shown (Fig. 5). Stitch the units together in each row, pressing seams in alternate directions for adjacent row. Sew the rows together in order, pressing seams in one direction. Make a total of (4) Block 1, each measuring 121/2" (31.75cm) square.

6. In the same manner, make (12) Block 2, (8) Block 3, (4) Block 4, and (4) Block 5 with the units and fabrics indicated in Figure 6.

## Quilt Top Assembly

7. Following the Quilt Layout diagram for block placement and orientation, arrange the blocks in diagonal rows, adding in the side and corner triangles where needed. Sew the blocks together in each row, pressing the seams in alternate directions for adjacent rows. Sew the rows together in order to complete quilt center measuring $683 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 853 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ $(173.67 \mathrm{~cm} \times 216.85 \mathrm{~cm})$.
8. Stitch the (9) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}(8.89 \mathrm{~cm}) \times$ WOF Fabric I strips sewn together end to end. Cut (2) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 853 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ $(8.89 \mathrm{~cm} \times 216.85 \mathrm{~cm})$ borders. Sew one border to each side of the quilt top center. From the remaining strip, cut (2) $31^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 74^{3} / 8^{\prime \prime}(8.89 \mathrm{~cm} \times 188.91 \mathrm{~cm})$ Sew (1) border to the top and the other to the bottom of the quilt top.

## Finishing

9. Sew together the (9) $2^{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}} \times \operatorname{WOF}(6.35 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF) Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
10. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
11. Leaving an $8^{\prime \prime}(20.32 \mathrm{~cm})$ tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" $(30.48 \mathrm{~cm})$ from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}(.64 \mathrm{~cm})$ and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
12. Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
