Foaling is a Distress Event

STAGES OF LABOR

1-4 hrs

Colic symptoms, pawing, sweating, increase RR/effort, gentle rolling

1

Foal to stand within 1 hour

5-20 mins

Water breaks, active straining, foal emerges

2

Foal to nurse within 2 hours

1-3 hrs

Passing of placenta

3

Mare to pass placenta within 3 hours

1-2-3 RULE

Up to 33% of Mares Experience Complications or Loss Before, During, and/or After Birth

BEFORE

1/3

of mares are at risk of losing their foal before birth (most within first 35 days)

DURING

10%

of mares experience complications during foaling (dystocia most common)

AFTER

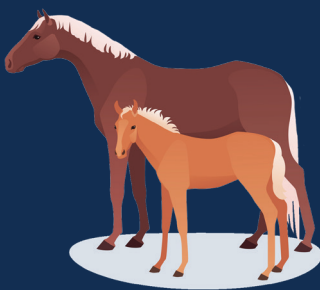
15%

of mares experience serious complications after foaling (for up to 3 months)

Complications and Compromised Mare Health Increases Odds of Foal Death

Foals from mares with compromised health have greater odds of death

- **19x** Abnormal placenta
- **18x** History of illness during pregnancy



Foals with complications are more likely to die

- **21x** Foals with seizures (in the first 24 hours)
- **16x** Foals with complications (during hospitalization)

Be notified to early signs of foaling with a smart halter™

Place your smart halter™ on your pregnant mare

30 days prior to her foal date and monitor her for at least 3 months thereafter.
