

## Angle Circular Walk

Region – Pembrokeshire

County/Area – Pembrokeshire Coast National Park

Length – 3.7 miles/6.0 kms

Duration – 2hours 30 minutes

Ascent – Rugged Coast path and open fields.

Grade –Easy/ Moderate

Start – Car Park, West Angle beach.

Postcode SA71 5BE (approx. location only)

### Walk Route Description

The Angle peninsula is wild and windswept, the Old Red Sandstone twisted and worn into smooth whale-backed clumps by gales. West Angle beach marks the beginning of the Haven waterway and so takes the brunt of the weather. There are good rock pools here and the bay is home to the rare cushion starfish.

### Route

- From the Car Park (Start Point), walk North joining the Coastal Path.
- Follow the path, continuing the circular route, overlooking the ragged coastline to your right, for approximately 2.7kms, passing the Chapel Bay Fort Museum and the RNLI Angle lifeboat station.
- Continue along the path passing the Old Point House (public House).
- Continue along the path and join the B4320, passing through the of Angle, returning to your start point.
