

Lochvane Circular Walk

Region – Pembrokeshire

County/Area – Pembrokeshire Coast National Park

Length – 3.2 miles / 5.2 kms

Duration – 1 hour 45 minutes

Ascent – Cliff edge, rugged coast and open fields

Grade – Easy/Moderate

Start – A487 (200ms west of the Puffin shuttle bus stop)

Postcode SA62 6BA (approx. location only)

Walk Route Description

The cliffs are spectacular on this stretch of the coast (250 feet) with great views back to Ramsey Island. The promontory of Dinas Fawr (with Dinas Fach beyond) is regarded as dangerous - don't be tempted to go onto the footpath out onto the point. Porthmynawyd is a secluded cove with a small popular beach accessible when the tide is out. The remains of a Norman motte can be seen at Pointz Castle.

Route

- From the start point, located on the A487, follow the footpath through the farm buildings south west passing through open fields for approximately 1.2kms. At the end of this path you join the Pembrokeshire Coastal Path.
- Turn right and continue along the rugged footpath for approximately 1.7kms, overlooking the coast to your right.
- Turn right, heading inland for approximately 500 metres reaching Elvis Farm.
- At Elvis farm turn right and East on the footpath for approximately 1 kilometre where you enter the hamlet of Lochvane.
- Pass the Cheese House holiday apartments on your right and continue East for approximately 800 metres returning to your start.
