

St Ann's Head Circular Walk

Region – Pembrokeshire

County/Area – Pembrokeshire Coast National Park

Length – 4.4 miles/7.0 kms

Duration – 2hours 30 minutes

Ascent – Rugged Coast cliff edge and reasonably level open fields.

Grade –Easy/ Moderate

Start – Car Park, Dale.

Postcode SA62 3RR (approx. location only)

Walk Route Description

There are sheer old red sandstone cliffs along the peninsula, with a nearly flat cliff-top plateau - the result of wave cut erosion when the sea was 200 feet higher some 400 million years ago. St Ann's Head on the Dale peninsula is the sunniest place in Wales and has some of the lowest rainfall figures in the region, so the chances of great views across the water to Skokholm are generally good.

Route

- From the Car Park (Start Point), walk North for approximately 50m.
- At the road junction, turn right and East and continue along the road to Davies farm house.
- At the farm house turn right and walk for approximately 20m.
- Take the footpath on your right and continue South until you reach the coastal path.
- On reaching the coastal path, turn right and continue on the path passing St Ann's Head lighthouse and the Officer's House.
- Continue North overlooking Frenchman's Bay.
- Approximately 100m past the bay turn right and East re-joining the road and returning to your start point.
