A WORD FROM OUR FOUNDER

Like many businesses, Greenstream had an unusual beginning. The company was born from a conversation in a pub in 2008! After a meeting of minds between a senior carpet representative and myself, and with my background in waste and communications, we started a conversation about the social/employment opportunity that could be created from capturing commercial carpet waste, sorting it, and regrading it into a potential second-life product and community opportunity.

The embodied carbon that goes into 'general carpet' is 9.76 kg per m^{2*}, over double the weight of the physical material (commercial carpet tile circa 4kg per m²). Passionate about reducing environmental impact and creating long-term skilled employment, some 12 years later Greenstream is cited as an exemplary example of a circular business model, in which materials already in circulation are creating real social, environmental, and economic value.

However, no-one could have predicted what happened in 2020, and it is fair to say that it has been a challenge for each and every one of us. However, despite COVID-19 this was the year that we welcomed a new executive board; saw real growth in our circular supply and fitting service with public bodies in particular; and received even more recognition that our work in converting a 'waste material' into a community opportunity. It is also an important part of a wider 'towards zero carbon' context. This was also the year we saw our good friends at TPAS Cymru (previously known as Tenant Participation Advisory Service) publish the 'Floored Report' which, we hope, will have an important and positive affect on Welsh housing standards in the future. More of that later.

Most importantly, we have been able to hold onto our staff family, the bedrock of the organisation.

Finally, this was the year that we won the 'Reuse of the Year' award from Carpet Recycling UK (CRUK) for the fifth year running and, despite a national reduction in the contract flooring sector, we still diverted over 51,100m² (the size of eight professional football pitches) of otherwise wasted carpet for the benefit of the community.

So, after a challenging year for all, this report sets out what we have managed to achieve in terms of social, economic and environmental output in 2020.



OUR AFFORDABLE FLOORING PROJECT

Overcoming Carpet Poverty

In 2012 we started the Affordable Flooring Project as a way of supporting people in the local community with low-cost flooring.

Social housing tenants are one of the most disadvantaged groups in Wales. For many, being able to afford basic furnishings at the start of a tenancy is extremely hard or simply unachievable. Despite this, it is common practice for social housing providers not to provide them - with the most basic one being carpets or flooring. Consequently, some social tenants end up living without carpets or appropriate flooring for many years, which, in many cases, can have a serious impact on the health and wellbeing of adults and children.

We now work with eight housing associations to provide their tenants with access to this scheme, whereby they can access flooring at a low cost. These are:

- Bron Afon Community Housing
- Cynon Taff Community Housing Group
- Newydd Housing Association
- Rhondda Housing Association
- Taff Housing
- Newport City Homes
- Hafod Housing
- Orbit.

The Floored Report and Carpet Poverty

This year saw the publication of the 'Floored Report,' which is produced by the two Welsh tenant voice organisations, TPAS Cymru (previously known as Tenant Participation Advisory Service) and Tai Pawb who worked in collaboration with us. This report highlights the fact that there is currently no provision for carpets provided by social housing landlords in Wales, and the effects that this lack of provision has on those unable to afford basic carpeting in their homes. The report also goes on to recommend a series of changes in housing policy in this area, and Greenstream is keen

to support further developments; particularly as we are dealing with tenants living on bare floors on a daily basis. The majority of these tenants are otherwise unable to access the basic warmth and insulation of carpet.

Saving Money

The cost of buying and fitting carpet can be high. The lowest cost for carpet we could find in a quick online search was £2.99 per m² - and that is without fitting. Based on supplying 4,872m² of carpet tiles in 2019, we have saved people at least £14,567.28 compared to purchasing new. Purely due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020 figure is lower, but on a pro-rata basis the effect remains the same. What is more, having carpets fitted can also help to reduce energy costs.

The carpet tiles laid down look fantastic. I'm thrilled, as the hallway now looks a lot warmer and welcoming. I am in a wheelchair and the hallway takes a lot of traffic and the carpet tiles are really hardwearing.

Wellbeing

We often underestimate the benefits of carpet and the difference it can make to a person's day to day wellbeing.

Carpet absorbs ten times more airborne noise than any other flooring. With many of the people accessing our Affordable Flooring Project living in multiple occupancy dwellings, this can make a big difference. Carpet reduces 'floor fatigue' in that it feels better underfoot and psychologically makes you feel warmer.

A lack of suitable flooring or carpeting can pose particular challenges for social housing tenants with children, particularly with those aged under 5 who are unable to play on the floor, as they risk injury from splinters in wooden floors.

COMMUNITY DONATION DAYS

Our free giveaway days

In January 2017, as a way of clearing some space in our warehouse, we decided to hold a giveaway event where we offered the local community our unwanted carpet tiles for free. It was an enormous success, and we now hold these events on a regular basis.

2020 has posed a particular challenge during the COVID-19 pandemic, but our team came up with the idea of allowing our visitors to book individual time slots to ensure social distancing was adhered to; enabling events to go ahead as planned.

Supporting the local community

Our Community Donations Days are known locally as 'Free Events' and the tiles we donate at these events, which have had to run via a click and collect system in 2020, provide free carpet to all members of our community whether they be local community groups or residents.

Our carpet tiles help individuals and families who have been without flooring, sometimes for years. South Wales community groups who have accessed much needed free carpet for their projects in 2020 include regional community hubs such as Vernon Place Community Hub in Neath, to charities

and support groups such as Rhondda
Food Bank and Boomerang in Cardiff, who
support the homeless and prevent social
exclusion and the effects of poverty via the
reuse of furniture. The Community Donation
days have even supported local primary
schools with much needed classroom
carpet in the past, as well as playgroups
and start-up small businesses. Our Free
Events are open to all, whatever the need.

In 2020 we donated 5,700m² of carpet tiles through our Community Donation Days.



We support local organisations on a caseby-case basis. A recent example of this was where we donated 300m² of new flocked flooring to the Vernon Place Community Hub, which was donated from flooring manufacturer Forbo Flooring Systems.



EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING

We work closely with local organisations and employment programmes to provide employment and training opportunities to local people. Most of our current team is made up of people who have come to us via back to work programmes and have faced long term unemployment.

We work in partnership with Elite Training and others to provide meaningful work experience to people with disabilities and those groups who face disadvantages within the workplace.

We treat all employees, placements, and volunteers equally, with access to a variety of internal and external training courses. In the last year our team accessed training in the following areas:

- Manual Handling
- First Aid
- Safeguarding Vulnerable Adults
- Forklift Driving
- Asbestos Awareness
- Flooring products
- Flooring fitting
- COVID care.

We seek to provide a workplace that is healthy and that cares for the wellbeing of all team members, supporting them wherever we can. Our aim is to provide everybody who comes to work with us with a positive experience that enables them to continue to learn and remain in sustainable employment.



on a 6-month Jobs Growth Wales contract, with a chance of full-time employment. After the end of that time I had learnt so much, and then Greenstream decided to take me on full-time. Since then I have gone from strength to strength. I had no qualifications and now have a lot! Since working I have become more independent, confident and continue to learn every day.



ENVIROMENTAL IMPACT

Approximately 15 million squares of new commercial carpet tiles are laid in the UK every year, with some 80% of these replacing previous commercial carpet tiles. Less than 1% of the total used is recovered, which means that over 99% are either buried or burnt (figures from Carpet Recycling UK).

This year, as in every year we guarantee we will not burn or bury any material that we manage and 2020 was no different. Out of the 51,100m² we diverted/managed none were sent to energy from waste (EFW), incinerated or landfilled. At present, material unsuitable for reuse is repurposed to be used as equine surface material within the UK. In relation to our Circular Supply and Fit service, we support clients to design out waste through the reuse/recycling of carpet tiles already in situ.

We also help support our clients to create innovative spaces that incorporate reuse and reduce the need for new material, where possible. Larger clients in 2020 have included Swansea, Cardiff and RCT Councils, all of whom have benefited from substantial environmental and economic savings of using a circular flooring provision.

Since we began, we have saved 634,000m² of carpet/2.5 million carpet tiles from going to waste. That is a pile over 6 miles high!








OUR ADVOCACY WORK
