## From our Formulary Lip Balm Base for Stick Formulations



A simple formula to make DIY lip balm – only 4 ingredients total! Use this as a base for stick formulations or reduce the amount of beeswax and increase the Lotioncrafter CCT or BioLatum for softer balm formulations. For lip plumping, consider adding Hilurlip or for additional moisturizing Oleo-HA.

## Formula

|         | Percent | Grams | Ounces | Ingredient                          |
|---------|---------|-------|--------|-------------------------------------|
| Phase A | 15.0    | 15.0  | 0.53   | Beeswax, Yellow or White            |
|         | 35.0    | 35.0  | 1.23   | BioLatum                            |
|         | 30.0    | 30.0  | 1.06   | Cocoa Butter, Natural or Deodorized |
|         | 20.0    | 20.0  | 0.71   | Lotioncrafter CCT or other oil      |

- 1. Combine all Phase A ingredients and heat to 75°C, continue mixing until all ingredients have melted.
- 2. Remove from heat and pour into lip balm tubes or lip balm pots. Plastic pipettes are an easy way to transfer into a tube.
- 3. Allow to completely cool before capping.

Makes approximately 100 grams or 3.5oz of lip balm.
