 effective suggestions were reviewed (getting a wood bench painting it and adding words
 buddy bench onto it). Or getting 3 cheaper benches. Derek to take this back to M Julia

5.0 Business arising from June minutes:

<u>PINK shirts</u>-Last March GB approved to amend the school uniform to allow for BH crested pink anti-bullying shirts to be worn on any day of the week (like grad/choir). It was agreed that this would send a positive message about being kind to kids every day (not just on anti-bullying day). There would be a drawing contest for the image on the shirt. The idea is not to raise funds for H&S, but to offer the t-shirt to those interested at approx. cost, or to add a small markup and donate the proceeds to an anti-bullying charity such as dare to care.

Our current clothing supplier (Promotions Janna) can provide pink shirts at a cost of \$6.50+ for QTY 300+ for XS to XL. There is an extra cost for the BH crested logo and the image on the front (total cost pending). Contest would be held in October, orders placed in November, and delivery before Feb 23rd, which is anti-bullying day. OPTION to add adult sizes for parents or staff who wish to participate. This was discussed and approved with Mrs Brayne and GB in June. Is M Maurice on board with allowing kids to wear this any day of the week beyond anti-bullying day? YES.

Vote on the price of the shirt:

Option 1-H&S subsidizes part of the cost of the T-shirt. Taken from what line item? And ALSO sends a donation amount to charity. Charge \$5-10 depending on cost.

Option 2-H&S pays for the T-shirts for all students (approx. 300). \$8x300=\$2400+ and would require parents to enter size and child name info online. Donation to charity. Option to order additional.

6.0 REPORTS:

6.1 Jungle Sport (M Maurice): postponed due to covid. No new date yet

6.2 New clothing/Used (Catherine)

<u>New:</u> June orders were delivered end Aug. Funds raised were approx. \$594. Next run is mid-Sep for end Oct/Nov delivery. Prices are going up in October so need to get order in before this. That will be the last order of the school yr. We used to have an order in Jan but did not generate enough sales so we dropped it.

<u>Used</u>: pre-loved bundles are catching on. Last year we have raised approx. \$550 since its inception in October 2019! Not to mention the clothing that we're keeping out of the landfill. Last year we raised just over \$331, and so far this year we have raised almost \$200. I have plenty of items left to bundle and will add throughout the year.

- **6.3 School Supplies** (Catherine): Approx 30% participation rate/ 99 orders this year versus 112 last year. We raised approx. \$420, this is 5% of total sales (under \$10k). Curious why more parents do not take advantage of this service. Any feedback? More reminders to parents.
- **6.4 Pizza** (Catherine) Avg 200 orders per day, 70% participation. Raised approx. \$4500 Run #1. Cheese only because daycare workers and lunch monitors are distributing them this year. Much simpler. 2 slices per box and no snack. Bita is coordinating the orders with Dominos.
- **6.5 Staff Appreciation-**We have a lead coordinator-Samantha Cinquino. Melissa Samuel and Krista Gendron have offered to help. First initiative this year was small treat in staff room. Biggest initiative is during the week of straw in Feb. Traditionally we offer a lunch to all staff as well as various treats and surprised throughout the week.
- **6.6 Terry Fox** (Marcia) When is it and what treats? Last Oct offered 8x \$10 cards for a draw for 1 card per grade level to students participating in terry fox run. No date yet. Fundraiser was not approved by GB yet.

6.7 Gr 6 grad (Celena)

- Planning for grad hoodie looking for sourcing if anyone knows
- Fundraising ideas-still needs to be remote-off school property. Ideas are Trivia night,
 Bingo night, Movies outside
- Lots of volunteers so far, looking for more

- **6.8 Fall fundraiser-** Are we doing this again? Last fall fundraiser generated approx. \$890 for epicure/ coffee/ bosapin trees (sold out early) and wreaths. Do we need to do another fall fundraising campaign, and are there other ideas for products to offer? Tabled until next meting.

7.0-New business/open floor/question

- Halloween-pumpkins -Mcgill Monique to look into. \$500 cost no approval required at meeting
- The floor had questions about giving back to community: Can BH look into orange shirt day and raising funds for Indigenous woman shelter in MTL. Mrs Maurice already has something planned for Orange shirt day. Turtle island trading post was mentioned. Last year we supported On Rock food bank, Friends with mental health and West island community shares.
