- $4 x$ winners of the child movie passes to cineplex


## 5.2: 12 days of Xmas contribution (Catherine Fini)

- Bad Monkey popcorn distributed on movie day: 360 bags -15 g bags salt and butter flavour
- Juice boxes for the pancake breakfast
- Bingo prizes for the holiday bingo (stock from holiday market-4 per class)


### 5.3 Holiday Market Update (Erica Ranjitsingh)

- Success! Well received by families and staff. We will make this an annual event
- Thank you to the kindness committee for helping to promote the event
- Mega Depot contact-product much better than our original plan
- Take away for next year: solicit wrapping and reusable bags, lots of volunteers needed
- Some of the extra stock used for: holiday bingo prizes (4 per class), open house gifts (50 snow molds), holiday baskets ( $6 \times \$ 30$ worth)
- Extra stock in the H\&S closet will be used for future prizes or next year's holiday market

- Awesome response from parent bakers-so many items were sent in!

## 6.Coordinator Reports:

### 6.1 Pizza Round 2 (Catherine Fini)

- Email sent out -shop open until January 22nd
- New: H\&S volunteers taking over distribution from lunch monitors: Thank you Bita Guzman and Christina Ciambella
- Question was raised on the use of baskets and which ones to use (laundry vs bins). We would need to find a place to store them and they can be bulky. Supervisors would rather pick them up on the way to the class so laundry baskets are ideal. Catherine and Bita to discuss offline.


### 6.2 Open House (Erica Ranjitsingh)

- 2 sessions will take place on Tues, Jan $17^{\text {th }}$
- H\&S providing small refreshments and take away gifts (snow molds-"we hope you had snow much fun at Beacon Hill")
- 6 parents to welcome and greet families-thank you to the volunteers


### 6.3 Staff Appreciation Week (Erica Ranjitsingh)

- Week of Feb $6^{\text {th }}$ (Mon to Thurs only. Fri is a ped day)
- Planning for a pot luck lunch, gift cards and other surprises
- We will solicit donations to fund this week, as we did last year
- Samantha Cinquino, Melissa Samuel and Erica Ranjitsingh have established a (surprise) theme


### 6.4 Carnival/Ice Wall (Sue Rack)

- Week of Feb 27th
- Activities organized by the BH staff
- Last year H\&S provided bingo prizes, gifts cards for Just Dance competition (\$5 DQ, 2 winners per class)
- No ice wall last year due to lack of volunteers (police checks) and no snack requested due to student breakfast in class
- H\&S contribution this year-Mr Lag has requested the following;
- Wednesday, March 1: Looking to find 300 bingo prizes. Super Bingo in the gym
- Friday, March 3: looking for snacks \& juice boxes for Jr and Sr movie event
- Just Dance competition: 2 gift cards to Wild Willy's per class plus 2 extra in case: \$5 each
- Ice Wall: H\&S has supported in the past. Requires heavy volunteer commitment and weather can be problematic. The appetite is not strong enough to continue this initiative
- Motion to approve 300 bingo prizes, snacks and 36 gift cards: Motion $1^{\text {st. }}$ Stephanie, $2^{\text {nd }}$ : Nadia. All in favour


### 6.5 Grade 6 Grad (Sue Rack)

- Expected or incurred expenses: grad year books (650), lunch on ceremony day (800), hoodies (1617)
- Expected or actual revenues: V-day raffle baskets 2000, F\&N fundraiser? jelly bean fundraiser?
- Plans for Valentine's raffle baskets- Online shop to open beginning Feb. Catherine can support how to run the virtual raffle.
- Felix and Norton, Jellybean fundraiser: confirmed but more detail to come.
- H\&S Contribution to grad: varies year to year (average \$2000). Require budget/plan to determine the additional funds required from H\&S (Neil). Budget requested for next meeting to then vote on the H\&S contribution.


### 6.6 Art Gala (Catherine Fini)

- Tues, April $4^{\text {th }}$, including $2^{\text {nd }}$ in person book fair
- Theme: Jungle
- Communication to teachers coming soon regarding classroom and raffle projects
- Sponsor and donation letter to be sent out soon


### 6.7 After school student activities (Malvina Spaleny)

- Activities run by Enfant et compagnie
- The plan is that 3 different classes are offered. This could change due to interest
- 5-week sessions starting Jan 23rd
- Pamphlets going home today (no online booking option)
- This is not a fundraiser. H\&S is facilitating this.
- Will review the success of this pilot after the March break to consider future application and scalability.
- Future idea-after school activity as fundraiser-see new business


### 6.8 Pre-loved clothing bundles (Catherine Fini)

- New pricing 5 items $/ \$ 5$ for 5 days
- Catherine has 60 bundles of pre-loved clothing and is looking to deplete the stock. Currently this is a labor-intensive process. Considering holding remaining items with Beacon Hill logo for future use/to sell in person for donation of choice
- Kristin (parent of Ellie): interested in bundles but unsure of sizing. She suggests a different format: clothing sale $1 x$ year. Catherine confirms we are heading in that direction.
- Neil suggests to feature clothing at events such as Open House. Catherine indicates that New Parent night might be more appropriate (Mrs Maurice seconds this idea). Catherine to sort by size and provide inventory for the June event.
- Beacon Hill Aid Fund: reminder that parents can reach out to school when requiring support. Clothing has been provided in these instances.


## 7.New Business/Open Floor/Question period (H \& S related items):

### 7.1 Spring Activity (Nadia Wendowsky)

- Replacing Jungle Sport with a new activity TBD
- Budget $\$ 3 \mathrm{k}$ (school has $\$ 500$ in reserve already from refunded deposit)
- Jungle Sport was planned for days. We can look at separate activities based on age; activities can be held indoors or outside. Timing: spring
- Catherine suggests: timing of this event can be changed as a welcome event in the fall
- Decision made to table this discussion for February meeting to pursue the subject further
- Ideas welcome by all


### 7.2 Sponsored Child (Catherine Fini)

- Kindness Committee will take over educating the students on our sponsored Child, and the related campaign to raise the funds
- Last year was a St-Patty's day pot of gold themed fundraising campaign
- Fee is $\$ 540$ per year in support of Plan International Canada


### 7.3 Anti-Bullying Day (Catherine Fini)

- Falls on Feb $22^{\text {nd }}$ this year
- Last year H\&S provided pink t-shirts (with message) for the entire school \& staff, and had "Lazylegz" Patuelli come in to speak to the kids about inclusion and overcoming challenges
- Mrs Maurice and Julia Di Staulo have secured a motivational speaker, Amen Iseghohi, to address older students. Subject focused on diversity.


### 7.4 Sponsor Calendar (Catherine Fini)

- Need a volunteer to take this on, or are we all fundraised out?
- Decision made to table to February meeting


### 7.5 After-school activity as fundraiser -agenda item added (Kirsten Nielsen)

- Future idea suggested and offered by Kirsten
- Self-defense/personal safety for girls \& boy
- Kirsten taught self-defense and the company worked for several LBPSB - training primarily for older children. Kirsten is offering to provide the training as a fundraiser; she has three hours of teachable content (safety, self-defense focused) which can be offered as a one-time or series
- Usual charge is $100 \$+$ for the course. H\&S can decide what to charge and $100 \%$ goes back to H\&S. 30 kids max
- Other parents with talents to lend? Example-soccer clinic/basic budgeting for kids etc
- Mrs. Maurice likes the idea and will discuss at the Staff Council meeting
