4. Reports:

4.1 President's report/members update (Catherine)

- 50 Members
- We signed up to receive new books from QFHSA again this year. They will provide some to add to the holiday baskets for BH's sponsored families

4.2 Treasurer's Report & Budget (Olivia):

- Teacher wish list: Both grade 2 teachers purchased \$350 worth of books each for their classrooms (total of approx. \$700 from the teacher's wish list budget)
- H&S purchased a new fridge for approx. \$900 since the old one was leaking
- \$250 for Piper Alan Jones (School Spirit budget)
- All expenses are now in for the Halloween Bash, we are net positive \$255 for this event

- 5.4 H&S new fridge-ordered! Will arrive on Dec 4th. Funds taken from H&S reserve
- **5.5 Teacher wish list items purchased**-Teachers reported that kids were very happy with new books for their own classroom selection

6. Coordinator Reports:

6.1 Super Recyclers: Catherine for Melissa L

- Tent this time instead of the trailer (tent was delivered instead of a trailer since we moved the date from Nov 21 to Nov 20th due to strike).
- Flyers were put up; email was sent out to parents and reminders on FB.
- Raised the most we ever have! \$220

6.2 Holiday Shop (Erica)

- 'Time-to-sign up' volunteer sheet sent out for wrapping supplies, and parents responded well, but we still need more supplies and volunteers for the event.
- Set up, Friday, December 1 starts on Monday Dec 4th. Shop will be open 3 days plus extra AM for parents are those who forgot. 8 volunteers per slot ideal given the amount of wrapping.
- We used the same supplier as last year/ lots of nice new items to offer
- \$2-15 max. Avg price around \$6.
- Flyers went home with kids, email sent, fb post
- Parents may consider purchasing items for the holiday baskets on the Thurs, Dec 7th
- Possible lunch bags for small items to be wrapped in and closed with holiday sticker (from dollarstore)
- Julie Taylor offered to make bags from wrapping paper to save time during event
- H&S taking 4 items from leftover stock per classroom for the holiday bingo prizes

6.3 Staff Appreciation Holiday treats and STRAW (Erica)

- Will open the TTSU to entire school because not all spots are full for staff baking on Thurs,
 Dec 21st.
- Staff will receive a box of baked goods, same as last year.
- STRAW: Possibly week of Feb 5th to 8th. No concrete plans as of yet to be reviewed and discussed on Jan 22nd

6.4 Grade 6 Grad (Bessie)

- Sweatshirts received and delivered to students
- Grads made \$331 from the bake sale
- Student activity TBC
- Bessie suggested an email to be sent to all parents on what the plan is, what the school is contributing vs. what support is required from the parents. Mrs Maurice will send this
- Bessie to be central point of contact for parents

6.5 Library (Bessie)

- Still missing volunteers to cover some slots
- January: Stephanie's MIL will be able to support
- There is still no librarian. The job is posted
- Bessie suggested that we need more books for boys
- All teachers received \$300 each from the library budget to purchase books for their classrooms

6.6 Open House-Jan 17: 9-11:30 / 1-2pm

- Flyer was created by Erica-posted to FB
- Bad monkey popcorn bags and refreshments (juice and water) will be offered
- Take away gift is Mittens "You are in good hands"
- Need 2 volunteers per slot to greet, keep parents' company if they miss a tour that has started, help direct traffic, replenish water bottles, keep the table tidy, etc.
- Email to parents will go out week back from Xmas break

6.7. Carnival (Catherine for Lisa T, who will be our new carnival coordinator)

- Week before March break. H&S contributions include Super bingo prizes (\$2-3 each from same supplier as holiday shop), snack, juice, and Just Dance competition prizes (Wild Willy's again? TBD)

• Discussion took place on how to market H&S to attract and retain volunteers. Concern was voiced that there are too many volunteer requests that go out, and how can we limit them or spread them out. Ideas included; Adding class parents (this would have to be approved at staff council once a brief is prepared describing how this would work); Send more flyers home instead of email communications only (however we are trying to get away from this for simplicity and environmental reasons); A running TTSU was suggested whereby we place all future volunteer asks in one document for easy access (this may be difficult to prepare ahead of time since we do not always have time slots). We will continue this discussion at our next meeting in January, and we are open to all suggestions.
