1.	A	The definition of a needs assessment is a systematic process for determining and addressing needs or gaps between current conditions and desired conditions or wants
2.	D	The first step is always look at the data. In this case, because the principal wants to look at subgroups, disaggregating the data to dig deeper to understand what is happening with certain students is key.
3.	В	Interdisciplinary units are all about horizontal standards alignment across content areas.
4.	В	Because the graph emphasizes subgroups and differences in scores, the best answer is B. Closing the achievement gap between subgroups is a huge part of leadership in education today.
5.	D	The first step is to look at the data. Then the principal can make decisions with the help of administration and staff.
6.	С	Having teachers share their success with other teachers is the most effective approach here. When teachers see their peers' success, they are more likely to want to engage in initiatives.
7.	A	All answer choices here are effective. However, A is the best answer because it goes further than all the other answer choices. Also, answer choice A has the word <i>alignment</i> . That is a good word. Mapping or aligning curriculum to the standards and test specifications and data analysis is key.
8.	A	When talking about all students in different subgroups, differentiation is key. While D has the words <i>standards-aligned</i> , it is wrong because of the <i>individualized</i> element.
9.	С	This answer choice has all the good words associated with PLCs: goals, objectives, common assessments, standards, progress monitoring, data analysis.
10.	С	This activity is all about engagement. The students are working together in groups, completing a KWL chart, and engaging in literature circles. The assistant principal cannot gauge learning or mastery here; she would need to see assessment data for that. Attitudes can be measured by surveys.
