1. In order to save her baby from being killed, Moses' mother sent him floating down the river in a basket, hoping that he would find a safe place to live. [Exodus 2]
2. The Pharaoh's daughter found baby Moses and had compassion on him, knowing that he was a Hebrew child. [Exodus 2: 5-10]
3. Many years later, Moses was called of God to deliver the Israelites out of Egypt and would often declared God's words, "Let My People Go!" [Exodus 7: 16]
4. One of God's wonders is when he turned Aaron's rod into a serpent. The Pharaoh's sorcerers tried to imitate a rod being turned into a serpent. [Exodus 7: 8-12]
5. The first plague of Egypt: River turned to blood. [Exodus 7: 15-21]
6. The second plague: Frogs. [Exodus 8: 2-6]
7. The third plague: Lice. [Exodus 8:16-19]
8. The fourth plague: Flies. [Exodus 8: 21-24]
9. The fifth plague: Diseased livestock. [Exodus 9: 3-6]
10. The sixth plague: Boils. [Exodus 9: 8-10]
11. The seventh plague: Thunderstorm of hail and fire. [Exodus 9: 18, 22-25]
12. The eighth plague: Locusts. [Exodus 10: 4-6, 12-15]
13. The ninth plague: Three days of darkness. [Exodus 10:21]
14. Before God sent the tenth plague, He commanded the children of Israel to cover their front doors with lamb's blood, symbolic of the Savior's atoning sacrifice. [Exodus 12]
15. The tenth plague: Death of the first-born son. [Exodus 12: 12, 29]
16. Exodus mean "going out," summarizing the story where the Hebrew's go out of Egypt into the wilderness to be free.
17. Thanks to Moses, a prophet of God, the Israelites traveled safely through the Red Sea. [Exodus 14: 16]
18. The pillar of fire protected the Israelites from the Egyptian army pursuing after them near the Red Sea. [Exodus 14: 20]
19. The parting of the Red Sea was a miracle for the Israelites, walking on dry ground with walls of water surrounding them. [Exodus 14: 21-22]
20. The Israelites forgot the Lord and asked Aaron to create a golden calf for the people to worship. [Exodus 32]
21. Moses received the 10 Commandments on two stone tablets. [Exodus 20 & 31]
22. God appeared and spoke to Moses on Mount Sinai. [Exodus 24: 12-18]
