1. William Dawes—the other rider who announced, “The British are coming!”
2. Benjamin Franklin’s birthplace
3. Old North Church—“1 if by land, 2 if by sea.”
4. The home of Paul Revere.
5. Paul Revere—rode to warn of the British Army advance.
6. The Boston Tea Party (*Dec. 1773*) was an act of protest against British Tea Act.
7. Continental Soldier
8. The green field represents the Boston Common.
9. Old South Meeting House—organization point for the Boston Tea Party.
10. The Boston Massacre occurred (*March 1770*) when British Soldiers open fire on colonists.
11. Faneuil Hall—where many speeches for independence were given.
12. Old Corner Bookstore built in 1712 and a bookstore since 1828.
13. Hessian Mercenaries, known to be ruthless, were hired by Britain to fight the colonists.
14. Bunker Hill Monument—first formal battle of the Revolution. “Don’t fire until you see the whites of their eyes.”
15. Quincy Market was completed in 1826 and revitalized in 1976.
16. The skirmishes at Lexington and Concord in April 1775 began the hostilities.
17. Benjamin Franklin was the only person at the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the Treaty of Paris—ending the war, and the Constitution.
18. Massachusetts State House
19. The Declaration of Independence was signed on 4 July, 1776.
20. St. Stephens Church—dedicated in 1804.
21. The Soldiers and Sailors Monument on the Boston Common.
22. The Colonial Soldiers became known as minute men for their hit and run techniques.
23. Kings Chapel—rebuilt in 1754.
24. Copp’s Hill Burial Ground—established in 1659.
25. Old State House features the Lion and the Unicorn from the United Kingdom Royal Coat of Arms.
26. Park Street Church completed in 1810.
27. Monument to the parents of Benjamin Franklin.
28. British Infantry Regulars, the red coats.
29. The USS Constitution, Old Ironsides, is anchored on the Charles River nowadays.
30. Boston—established 7 September, 1630.
