MANTI

Manti was the first community to be settled outside the Wasatch Front and became the hub for the formation of other communities in Central Utah. The Manti temple was the fifth temple built by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saint and is a large landmark in the area's skyline. The two-week-long Mormon Miracle Pageant is hosted in Manti annually. Though located in southern Utah, Manti's higher elevation keeps the climate cooler than other populated areas of Utah, especially during the summer with highs averaging in the mid-80s and winter highs in the mid-30s (*Fahrenheit*).
