Midway is a sleepy, small town located in the Heber Valley in Wasatch County, Utah. Known for the event called Swiss Days, Midway brings thousands of people to the town. The event started in 1947 and was originally known as Harvest Days. In order to attract larger crowds to Midway, the idea of using a Swiss theme was created by Orma W. Wallengren whose family owned and operated the Homestead, replacing the name and theme of Harvest Days with Swiss Days.
