Home to some of the tallest trees on Earth, Redwood National Park also protects vast prairies, oak woodlands, wild riverways, and nearly 40 miles of pristine coastline, all supporting diverse wildlife and cultural traditions.

1. Great Horned Owl—This is the largest owl that can be found in Redwood National Park. They are the epitome of the “hooting owl.”
2. Spotted Owl—slightly smaller than its tenacious competitor, the Barred Owl.
3. Chandelier Tree—I was amazed at how many cars made it through the famous tree no matter how tight the squeeze.
4. The ferns of Redwood—with the shade and moisture of the forest, ferns thrive here.
5. Redwood National Park was established January 1, 1968.
