1. Hyacinth Macaw – this beautiful blue parrot is native to South America. Macaws are longer than any other species of parrot.
2. Christ The Redeemer Statue - Arms outstretched, the art deco statue of Christ crowns the Corcovado (*Hunchback*) Hill.
3. Rio cruise ship – with its temperate climate and high social atmosphere, Rio is a popular destination for cruise ships.
4. Sugarloaf Island - More than a million tourists visit Sugarloaf every year to enjoy a breathtaking view of surrounding beaches, mountains and forests. Just Wow!
5. Sugarloaf Cable Car - Opened in 1912, it was only the third cableway to be built in the world.
6. Fort Copacabana – up until 1987, Fort Copacabana was the coastal defense artillery branch for Rio.
7. Beach - the young and young-at-heart enjoy the beaches in Rio. There are several beaches made famous by various performers.
8. Guanabara Bay was described by author Herman Melville in this way... Rio is the Bay of all Rivers — the Bay of all Delights — the Bay of all Beauties.
9. Fishing, yachting and sail boats of all varieties navigate into the bay as part of the year round summer climate.
10. Scarlet macaw – the vibrantly colored Scarlett Macaw can be found mostly in the rainforests. Macaws mate for life and live in large noisy groups.
11. Harlequin macaw – These cousins to the other Macaws display such a beautiful array of color. Like the other, they prefer a diet of clay, nuts, and berries.
12. A world visitor destination – visitors from around the world come to Rio to vacation or enjoy the sites. In the puzzle, how many nations flags can you name?
13. Humaitá – the residential district in the South Zone of Rio De Janeiro.
14. Jurujuba – near the beach and known for delicious preparation of fresh seafood.
15. Corcovado Mountain – Corcovado Hill lies just west of the city center but is wholly within the city limits and visible from great distances. It is known worldwide for the 125 ft (38m) statue of Jesus atop its peak.
