Colonial Williamsburg is a living history museum covering 300 acres. Visitors can experience what it was like to live in the 18th century. Complete with characters in period costumes and even the dialog of the time, hear the stories of the city's citizens—black, white, and native American, slave, indentured, and free. Colonial Williamsburg has hundreds of restored, reconstructed, and historically furnished buildings as part of the restoration of America's prominent past. Colonial Williamsburg's motto is "That the future may learn from the past."

7. Williamsburg was founded in 1699 as the capitol of the Virginia Colony.
