1. Looks like this gingerbread man stole a snowman's nose. See if you can find the other 12 trickster gingerbread men in this painting.
2. Hear the carolers and friends sing Christmas songs under the Alpine gazebo located in Legacy Park.
3. A visit from old Saint Nicholas! What a wonderful treat for all!
4. "Once there was a snowman..." There are 20 snowmen scattered throughout Alpine, can you find all of them?
5. The Old Red Brick Meeting House is getting ready for the holidays for both snowman and gingerbread men alike.
6. The Alpine City Hall was built in 1936 and is still used today.
7. Simply known as the Relic House, this museum—dedicated to the pioneers—was constructed from 1857-1863 to serve as a meetinghouse for early settlers.
8. Kencraft Candy and the Peppermint Place were long time attractions in Alpine for 44 years.
9. The Old Alpine School House—originally called the Old Red Schoolhouse—was finished in 1901 and educated students until 1965.
10. You are never too old to make snow angels!
11. This city was originally settled as Mouthainville in 1851. When the city was incorporated on January 19, 1855, the name was changed to Alpine.
12. Try your hand at Cross Country or Alpine skiing. It's totally worth it!
13. Tubing, sledding, or tobogganing, call it what you will, I call it fun!
