4. Lou Malnati's deep dish pizza – drool.
5. Marc Malnati – Owner of Lou Malnati's Pizzeria, the oldest name in Chicago pan (*deep-dish*) pizza.
6. Home of the Cubs baseball team.
7. Randy Stancik – General Manager at Willis Tower/Skydeck Chicago.

9. The Chicago flag was adopted in 1917.
10. Eric's dream toy company since he was a boy.
