LEHI ROLLER MILLS

Besides being part of the set for the movie Footloose, Lehi Roller Mills has been known since 1906 for their high quality baking flour and gourmet baking mixes. It's one of the oldest continuously operating flour mills in the country and is family owned to this day.

1. At the time Footloose was filmed, Lehi Roller Mills was surrounded by nothing but open fields.
2. Cedar Valley Farms, where the best wheat grows for the best flour.
3. There were five official filming locations for Foot Loose in Utah: Lehi, Provo, American Fork, Payson, and Orem.
4. Lehi Roller Mills was listed on the U.S. National Register of Historic Places in 1994.
5. The place where Ren McCormacki worked and held his high school dance.
6. Each day, for six days, 100,000 lbs of flour are made. That's almost as much as a tank!
7. The classic turkey and peacock paintings were done in 1930 by Stan Russon. He used a rope and pully system to manually raise and lower himself to be able to paint.
8. Each bushel of wheat is still selected by-hand today!
9. Happy Valley Farms, the place where you can pick-your-own-berries and other foods you love. You can even bring your own jar.
10. Smith Brothers Farms, a family owned dairy farm since 1920.
