1. Old School Country—Johnny Cash has sold 90 million records worldwide and Dolly Parton is famous for having 25, No. 1 hit songs.

3. New Country—Carrie Underwood became famous after winning American Idol and Brad Paisley became a member of the Grand Ole Opry.
4. Jack's Barbeque is the BBQ King of Nashville! Now that is a title.
5. As the saying goes at The Stage on Broadway!—"a Rockin' Country Club, "the whiskey's on Ice and the Music's on Fire."
6. The Roberts Western World used to be a warehouse, then a shop that sold guitars called Sho-Bud Steel Guitars until the 1980s.
7. Second Fiddle is a honky tonk with Attitude! A Honky Tonk is a bar that lets country musicians play, mostly seen in the south.
8. F.H.E. Family Home Evening has been a regular thing in Nashville since the 1950's. Cool!
9. Legends Corner is considered the home of legendary live country music. Don't miss out!
10. Banner for the Vanderbilt University Commodores, which were founded in 1873.
11. The Tennessee state flag was adopted on April 17, 1905.
12. Eric arrived in Nashville on the day of the CMA's, the Country Music Association—what an experience!
13. Nashville Crossroads is home for live Country and Southern Rock! You can't miss it!
14. Ernest Tubb's record shop—Home of the Midnight Jamboree for over 60 years.
15. Betty Boots is where your inner cowgirl can be found with authentic boots.
16. Broadway Brewhouse and Mojo—the name says it all.
17. Nashville Music City Visitors Center—built in 2013.
18. Paradise Park Trailer Resort enjoys celebrating Redneck and Hillbilly life with a "trailer park" atmosphere!
19. The Nashville First Baptist Church was organized on July 22, 1820.
20. Customs House Building—built in 1875— is made of limestone.
21. Union Station Tower serviced eight railroads in the early 1900s.
