1. Crater Lake National Park is 1,932 deep as so clear you can see up to 70 feet.
2. Olympic National Park is located in Washington and was established in 1938.
3. Mt. Rainier National Park can be seen from Victoria, British Columbia.
4. Grand Teton National Park is located in Wyoming and was established in 1929.
5. Black Hills National Park is home to Mount Rushmore, where the four presidents faces are carved into the mountain.
6. Acadia National Park was originally called Lafayette National Park.
7. Independence Hall National Park is known as "America's most historic square mile."
8. Yorktown National Park is where the last major battle of the Revolutionary War happened.
9. Gettysburg National Park is famous for being the largest battle in the Civil War and where Lincoln delivered his address.
10. Jamestown National Park is no longer a town but a historic site, standing as a reminder of its importance in the early development of this nation.
11. Boston National Park is located in Massachusetts.
12. Williamsburg National Park contains the nation's second oldest college.
13. Smoky Mountains National Park is the most visited out of all the parks, more 9 million visitors a year.
14. Mesa Verde National Park was recognized for its incredible cliffs dwellings that were made by the Pueblo Indians.
15. Bryce Canyon National Park was formed by frost wedging and dissolving rainwater.
16. Grand Canyon is one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World, located in Arizona.
17. Zion National Park is named after the Hebrew word "Zion" which means "a place of peace."
18. Yellowstone National Park is the oldest US National Park, founded in 1872.
19. Yosemite National Park contains 3 of the highest waterfalls in the world.
20. Sequoia National Park was the second national park established in 1890.
21. Glacier National Park symbol is the mountain goat.
22. Arches National Park holds over 2,000 natural arches, including the famous Delicate Arch.
23. Redwood National Park was established in 1968.
24. Rocky Mountain National Park was established in 1915.
