San Antonio was named after St. Anthony of Padua on his feast day June 13, 1961. Missions were built all along the San Antonio River, like the famous Mission San Antonio de Valero. When it befell to neglect, it became a make shift fort, where the Siege of The Alamo took place in 1836, one of histories most revered landmarks, tied with the phrase "Remember the Alamo." On the flip side, The Riverwalk is the cities showpiece, known for its food and entertainment; it has revolutionized modern urban areas since the 1930's. Not many people realize that San Antonio is the 7th largest city in the nation and the 2nd largest in Texas, so make sure to join Eric on the San Antonio Riverwalk as you build this puzzle with family and friends!

5. Terry gave a great tour around the Spanish Governor's Mansion for Eric—built in 1722.
6. Only can Bufe Coker, who works at the San Antonio Western Shooting, can help you become a real cowboy.
7. Mark Twain called San Antonio "one of Americas Four unique cities."
8. Trolleys are a great way to see the sights. Make sure to "Remember the Alamo!"
9. David "Davey" Crockett was the last man standing at the Battle of the Alamo.
10. T-Bone is the mascot of the San Antonio Rampage hockey team.
