4. The "End of the Trail" sign —built in 1940—commemorates the Lewis & Clark expedition where they traveled 4,000 miles for two years.
5. Experience the 2-mile long Seaside beach in a unique way by riding a surrey!
6. Pig-N-Pancake was established in 1961 and a must visit in Seaside.

8. The Seaside Aquarium—built in 1924—is a lot of fun!
