10. Geocentric: the theory that earth is the center of the Universe. The word for ‘Earth’ in Greek is geo.
11. Heliocentric: the now accepted idea that the sun is the center of our solar system, not the Earth.
12. Galileo, devised a telescope that could enlarge objects up to 20 times and with it, he was able to prove the truth of how we live in heliocentrism system.
13. Saturn, the fifth brightest object in the solar system, can be seen with the naked eye, and studied clearly through binoculars or a small telescope.
14. Copernicus was the first man who brought the theory ‘heliocentric’ to the world of the Renaissance and used his own observations of the movements of the planets to back up his idea.
15. The spiral Andromeda galaxy is the nearest galaxy to the Earth, about 2.5 million light years away, apart from smaller companion galaxies such as the Magellanic Clouds.
16. Because the moon has no atmosphere, it is unprotected from cosmic rays, meteorites and solar winds, and has huge temperature variations. The lack of atmosphere also means no sound can be heard on the Moon.
17. The Moon’s gravity at the surface is only 17 percent that of Earth’s, meaning instead of jumping about 5 feet you jump 10, an NBA hoop height.
18. Voyager of Nova and Vix, the first flying boat to explore the Midnight galaxies.
