10. The Ahwahneechee people live in what is now the park but their neighbors called them the yohhe'meti, meaning "they are killers." Viola, Yosemite is a "killer" park.
11. The old "Woody" wagon was a favorite family touring vehicle.
12. The California State flag
13. Drop the top and bring some friends. Almost 4 million visit the park every year.
14. The California state symbol, bears are still seen in the park—usually sans ice cream.
15. The early image of Yosemite captured by George Fisk are considered unmatched even today.
16. Merced River—great for floating and fishing.
17. The park is a great place for family outings and picnics.
18. Layfayette Bunnell is credited with discovery and naming of the park.
19. Yosemite National Park was established October 1, 1890.
