# PRIZE IDEAS

# BABY ANIMAL NAMES

## What You'll Need

Master list of animals with answers  
Answer sheets (print out as many as needed)  
Pens

## How To Play

Set a time for everyone to complete their list  
of baby animal names (1 minute.)

When everyone is finished, read the correct words  
out loud, and have guests score themselves.

Give a prize to the guest with the highest score.

# DIAPER DERBY

There's something so outrageously funny about grown adults in hastily assembled toilet paper diapers-your guests won't be able to stop laughing!

## What You'll Need

A toilet paper roll per team

## How To Play

Divide your guests into teams and hand each team a roll of toilet paper.

Give the teams five minutes to wrap a team member up in a mock diaper.

The team with the most creatively diapered 'baby' wins.





# THE ULTIMIMATE BABY SONG LIST

## What You'll Need

Blank paper for answers  
pens

## How To Play

Give each guest a pen and paper and ask them to write down every song they can think of with the word 'baby' in the title in 5 minutes.

It sometimes helps with this game to play this as a team event pairing guests up often gets the song name juices flowing



# FIND THE GUEST

This is a great icebreaker!

## What You'll Need

Pen and paper for each guest  
Some interesting facts about your guests (before the party)

## How To Play

Before the party, look through your list of guests, and make a note of any fun facts about each guest. Eg: Who has 6 kids?. Who was born in England? etc.

Then, type up a list of all the facts without saying who it belongs to, print copies of the list, and leave one in each guest's seat.

When everyone arrives at your baby shower, guests will have to get to know each other to find out which fact belongs to which guest.

The guest with the most correct answers wins.



# HOW BIG IS THE BELLY?

## What You'll Need

A roll/ball of string per player

## How To Play

Using a ball of string or wool, have each guest pull out a length that they believe would perfectly fit around your (Mum to be) pregnant belly.

After they have cut their string to the appropriate length, compare the results to your actual tummy. (Make sure no one is cheating by measuring their own or a friend's waist).

Whoever has a string that comes closest to being a perfect measurement, wins.



# ALL ABOUT MUM

## What You'll Need

A prepared list of trivia questions  
notepad and pen for recording answers

## How To Play

Before the baby shower, prepare a list of questions about the mum-to-be, with her help, of course. The questions can focus on fun facts from her babyhood/childhood, or her present life, or both.

Examples of questions:

- What date is her birthday?
- What's the name of her high school?
- Where did the expectant parents meet?
- What is the name of her pet?
- Where does she work?

Names of siblings

At the baby shower, read the questions out loud,  
and have the guests call out the answers.

Designate one person to be in charge of noting who guesses correctly.

The guest with the most correct answers wins



# DON'T SAY BABY

## What You'll Need

5 clothes pegs per guest

## How To Play

When your guests arrive, pin five pegs onto them and offer a single instruction: Don't say "baby."

Have your guests keep their ears open, and if they hear anyone say the word "baby," they get to take away one of that person's pegs.

The guest with the most pegs at the end of the baby shower is the winner.

This simple baby shower game is fun, and it encourages guests to interact in an interesting way.



# BABY SHOWER MEMORY GAME

## What You'll Need

A tray with a range of baby-related items  
e.g. Bib, nappy, rattle, nail clippers, baby sock etc.  
A pen and paper per guest

## How To Play

Give each guest a pen and paper and show them the contents of the tray for one minute.

Cover the tray with a teatowel and give them three minutes to write down as many items from the tray as they can remember.

The person who remembers the most correct items, wins.

To make this game a little trickier, include large and small items on the tray.



# GUESS THE BABY FOOD

## What You'll Need

7 - 10 jars of different flavours of baby food

## How To Play

If you've ever thought that baby food in jars looks less like the 'peas' or 'Carrots' they purport to be and more like miscellaneous mush, this is the game for you.

Gather seven to ten unique flavors of baby food jars, number each lid and tear off the labels.

Ask each guest to grab a spoon and start sampling!

The guest with the keenest taste buds wins a prize for getting the most correct.



# BABY BIRTHDAY POOL

## What You'll Need

Pens and paper for each guest  
1 printed calendar of the expected birth month

## How To Play

Before beginning the game, ask the mom-to-be to reveal her anticipated due date.

Remind everyone that only 5 percent of babies are born exactly on their due date! Then, ask each guest to predict the day and the time the baby will be born, and write their prediction on the paper or calendar.

You can promise to give a prize to each person who picks the correct day and also to the person who most closely picks the time.

Don't forget to send those prizes out after the baby is born.





# FEED THE BABY

## What You'll Need

A large bib per team

## How To Play

Get ready to regress! You'll have guests drooling food, making messes and laughing uncontrollably with this baby shower game.

Give each person a large bib and divide the party into teams of two.

Each team is given a jar of applesauce and two small spoons. One team at a time, you'll blindfold the pair and have the team members feed the applesauce to one another at the same time.

Clock each team's time. The fastest duo to finish their apple sauce wins. Of course, the best part is watching everyone spill and dribble all over themselves!



# BABY PRODUCT MADNESS

## What You'll Need

Pen and paper for each guest

## How To Play

Giving each guest a pen and paper, ask them to list as many baby products as they can in 3 minutes.

These lists start easily enough but most people will have to start digging deep to keep writing for the full 3 minutes. Award a prize to either the guest with the most products, or the most questionable product!



# LETTERS TO THE BABY

## What You'll Need

Pens and paper for each guest

## How To Play

This is less a game, and more a lovely activity that all guests will want to participate in.

After supplying them with notepaper and a pen, ask each guest to write a short note to your baby.

This may be something they want to think about while they enjoy the festivities of your baby shower, but ask each of them to place their note into an envelope you have handy before they leave.

These notes are a wonderful keepsake and will give you the warm-and-fuzzies long after your guests have left the party.



# THE FAMOUS MUM

## What You'll Need

Name tags with names of famous mothers written on each

## How To Play

Before your guests arrive, write or print the names of some famous mothers onto name tags for each guest.

You could choose a category like mothers in fiction, mothers from current or classic TV shows or movies, or anything you wish.

When your guests arrive, attach a name tag to the back of each guest, without letting the guest see the name.

Ask everyone to walk around and ask "Yes" or "No" questions of the other guests to figure out whose name is on her back. It's a great icebreaker, and it may help guests who aren't acquainted find some common ground.



# NAME THE CELEBRITY CHILD

## What You'll Need

Copy of list of parents for each guest  
1 answer sheet  
pens / pencils

## How To Play

Give out an answer sheet to each guest

Set a time of 1 minute for guests to answer as many as possible

Read out answers and get them to score themselves  
one point for each name. (If they guess all 3 children,  
then they get 3 points).
