On February 6, 1973, we went to, the American Indian Movement went to, Custer, South Dakota, to protest the judicial handling of Westley Badheart Bull's murder. We went there to bring attention to the fact that he was murdered by a white man and this kind of treatment had to stop. And I made a statement that, "Today was a good day to die". And I meant that in reference to the killings of Native People, the discrimination, the bigotry, the racism, that all of that had to stop. That it was a good day to die for racism, a good day to die for discrimination, a good day to die for bigotry and all those discriminatory policies that they've had toward Native People. That was my reference. The term "A Good Day to Die" was first spoken by Crazy Horse, the great Oglala warrior. We made a documentary about my life story and the rise of the American Indian Movement and then from that clip of my speech, before we went to Custer, was me talking about, that it was a good day to die.
