## CARE + MAINTENANCE

| WOOD           | Clean surfaces with a dry or damp soft cloth. Do not use abrasive, oil or chemical based cleaners. It is recommended to use coasters or trivets to protect surfaces from heat marks and water stains. Wipe up spills immediately in order to avoid staining.  |

| METAL          | Clean surfaces with a dry or damp soft cloth. Do not use abrasive or oil based cleaners. Periodically check and tighten hardware as necessary. It is recommended to use coasters or trivets to protect surfaces from heat marks and water stains. Wipe up spills immediately in order to avoid staining                               |
| LEATHER        | To clean leather, start by vacuuming up surface debris with a hose attachment. Next, spray a microfiber towel with leather cleaner or saddle soap and wipe the seats down. For stubborn dirt, you can spray the cleaner directly on the seats and scrub them gently with a soft-bristled brush.                                       |
| marble / Stone | Dust the surface once or twice a week with a soft cloth. Wash the marble periodically with a cloth dampened with warm water, and, if necessary, a bit of mild dishwashing liquid. Remove the soap with a damp cloth and wipe dry with another clean soft cloth. Never use dusting sprays or abrasive cleaners on marble surfaces.     |
| CANVAS         | Routine vacuuming or light brushing is recommended. Use the upholstery attachment and crevice tool of your vacuum to remove loose particles. We recommend this at least once or twice a month.  |
|                | For light cleaning, mix $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of mild soap and a gallon of tepid water. Allow the mixture to soak the fabric. Be sure to rinse the area completely and allow your fabric to air dry. To spot-clean a removable cover, mist the area with a mixture of water and mild soap, then scrub with a sponge or brush.             |
| FELT + WOOL    | Vacuum fabric as needed, using the upholstery attachment and crevice tool of your vacuum to remove loose particles. Do not brush fabric or use a vacuum attachment with a rotary brush. Brushing may permanently damage the nap or change the character of the fabric.  |
|                | To spot clean, dampen a soft, white cloth with cool water and dab at the stain until clean. For stubborn stains, you can use diluted white vinegar to clean the felt. Use one part vinegar and two parts water to get the proper dilution for this. Repeat the same process of dabbing at the stain with your vinegar/water solution. |
| BRASS          | Clean surfaces with a dry or damp soft cloth. Do not use abrasive or oil based cleaners. Periodically check and tighten hardware as necessary. It is recommended to use coasters or trivets to protect surfaces from heat marks and water stains. Wipe up spills immediately in order to avoid staining.                              |
| GLASS / MIRROR | Use products specifically designed for glass. Spray glass cleaning solution onto a microfiber cloth before wiping the glass or mirror. Do not spray cleaning solution directly onto the glass or mirror. For best results, wipe the glass a second time with a clean, dry microfiber cloth.   |
