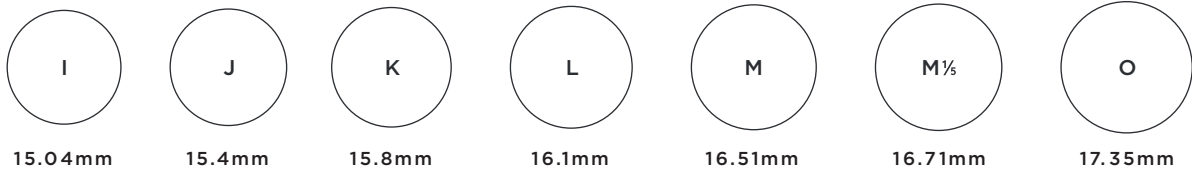


Ring sizes are very specific and it's important to ensure your measurements are correct. There are a few ways you can measure your size.

STILL UNSURE OF YOUR RING SIZE?

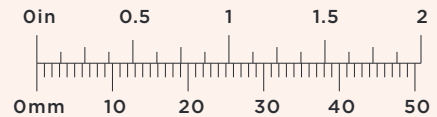
Print out this PDF to determine your size. Match the circle with the inside of an existing ring to determine your size.



*When printing, do **NOT** tick 'fit to page' this will ensure the sizes are accurate

CONFIRM PRINTED PAPER SIZE

Be sure to print at 100% and compare the scale with a ruler to ensure accuracy. If measurement is not accurate, ring size measurement will not be completed properly.



DON'T HAVE A PRINTER?

Here are two methods to help you out:

The preferred method is set out below:

Take a ring you already own that properly fits your chosen finger.

Get a ruler that shows measurements in millimeters.

Place the ring over the ruler matching the left inside edge of the ring to the first mark on the ruler. The ruler's edge should run directly through the center of the ring effectively cutting the ring in half and creating two half circles. The line of the ruler should be just visible on the inside of the ring band.

Note down the millimeters between the walls of the ring. This is the internal diameter (most average ring sizes fall between 14.1mm and 22.6mm).

If the ring falls between two measurements, order the larger measurement. This will ensure the ring can pass over the knuckle which is often larger than the rest of the finger.

The second method for measuring size is to record the circumference of the finger. The best way to do this is set out below:

Firstly take a piece of string and lightly wrap it around the chosen finger. The string should feel snug but comfortable.

Take a marker and mark on both pieces of string the point where they overlap to form a complete circle. This is the desired circumference of the ring (most average ring sizes fall between 44.2mm and 71.0mm).

Measure the string against a ruler and note down the length.

Again, if the measurement is between sizes go for the larger one.
