# Hello and Happy Decorating!

This document contains a collage with the decorating steps from the Mother's Day 2024 Cookie Cutter release. I hope this is helpful as you decorate these cookies!

Each Collage shows a feature photo and then the step-by-step process photos. A collage of the mini cookies is also included in this guide. To create these collages, it requires hundreds of photos to be taken. As a result, a few photos are missed. In that case a note is made on the collage page and a written instruction is provided.

I have provided a list of the icing colors used in each set's palette. Unless otherwise noted, royal icing colors are used in both a piping and flooding icing consistency. I used a tip #2 on the piping bags for outlines and details. If I used a different tip, I made a note on the collage page!

### Love you Loads Cookie Set



**Icing Colors:** Chefmaster Sunset Orange, Lemon Yellow, Turquoise, White, Black Diamond (2 shades black only in piping consistency and gray in a 20-sec icing consistency), and Bakers Rose.



## Laundry Detergent



I used PME tip #1.5 with the black to pipe the text. You can find a 'Love you Loads' graphic/template on the last page of this guide. I used a projector to add the piped text on the sleeve of the latte. The fonts are called DTC Paper Skate and Kindly Regular.



### Laundry Basket



I scraped a thin layer of white icing on the background to create the inside of the basket. Then I piped the outline of the basket on top. Because the 'laundry' on top is such small areas, I only used the flood icing to outline and flood those small areas.



#### Proverbs 31:25 with Vine Circle



When outlining the cookie, I was careful to keep the outline on the edge of the cookie to ensure the stencil would fit on the surface of the cookie. Stiff icing works best when stenciling and I prefer to use the stencil genie to hold the stencil in place while I'm scraping the icing. I used a #1 tip to pipe the vine on the edge of the circle.

Icing Colors: White, Sugar Art Lilac, and Sugar Art Sage



#### Cookie Scribe



I piped and flooded the flower on top, but because these icing areas are small, I used the only the flood icing to create the 'beads' and the scribe itself (gray area).

Icing Colors: Chefmaster White, Turquoise, Lemon Yellow, Bakers Rose (a tiny dot of deep pink), Black Diamond (a tiny dot for gray), and Cookie Countess Preppy Pink



### **Groovy Mom**



Icing Colors: Chefmaster White, Turquoise (pipe only), Lemon Yellow, Bakers Rose (pipe only a tiny dot of deep pink), Black Food Marker, and Cookie Countess Preppy Pink

The letters and details on this cookie will stand out if the base of the cookie is flooded white first. I did use a project to pipe the designs, but you could also trace it using a yellow marker.

See the template on the last page. I used PME tip #1.5 to outline the letters before flooding.



## M-O-M Baking Set



Icing Colors: Chefmaster White, Turquoise, Lemon Yellow (pipe only), Bakers Rose (a tiny dot of deep pink), Buckeye Brown, Cookie Countess Preppy Pink, and a Brown and Yellow Food Marker



# M with Rolling Pin



Using the cutter as a guide, I traced the edge of the rolling pin onto the cookie with a yellow marker to guide my piping. I added the wood grain using the brown food marker. I add the 'knots' of wood first and then add the lines for the grain.



# O with Piping Bag



Using the cutter as a guide, I traced the edge of the piping bag onto the cookie with a yellow marker to guide my piping.



# M with Spatula



Using the cutter as a guide, I traced the edge of the spatula onto the cookie with a yellow marker to guide my piping.



#### **Orchid Cutter Set**



**Icing Colors:** Make these cookies in a variety of colors! I used Sugar Art Lilac, Sugar Art Sage Green, Chefmaster Coal Black, White, and a yellow marker.



### Orchid



I used the template on the last page to trace the center/larger orchid and the stem onto the cookie.



#### So Glad I Am Y'orchid Plaque



Stiff icing works best when stenciling and I prefer to use the stencil genie to hold the stencil in place while I'm scraping the icing. I used the lilac icing.



### Cozy Day for Mom Set



**Icing Colors:** Sugar Art Autumn Gold, Dusty Rose, Taupe, Ivory (flood only), Turquoise Waters + a tiny dot of ivory, Sage (soft pipe only), and Chefmaster White.



### Cozy House Plant



I added a few extras dots of water to the Sage icing color to have a little flow to the icing so that the 'leaves' had a rounder smoother look. I used a tip #1.5 to add these details. I added the leaves using a teardrop shape of icing. I found that some of the plant stems did overlap. Therefore, I started with the 'stems' on the outside and worked my way in so that the center stem would be on top. To keep the heart rounded, I added it using the flood icing.



### Cozy Open Book



Reduce and eliminate craters and cracks in small icing areas by adding a little piping icing in those areas before flooding (like the heart). This structure underneath will keep that icing smooth and puffed up.



# Cozy Jar Candle



I used tip #2 to pipe the word 'Relax'. I freehanded the text, but you can find a graphic/template on the last page of this guide. The font is called DTC PAPER SKATE.



#### Cozy Tea Cup



This cookie features a small wet-on-wet area for the tea. I used the ivory flood icing with a small swirl of white flood icing. I used a tip #1.5 to add the steam on the tea. I preferred to flood the top of the cookie white to help the steam stand out and be more pronounced. That top area could also easily be turned into whipped cream if you want to make a cup of hot cocoa.



# MINI Cozy Day for Mom Set



Icing Colors: Sugar Art Autumn Gold, Dusty Rose, Taupe, Ivory (flood only), Turquoise Waters + a tiny dot of ivory, Sage (soft pipe only), and Chefmaster White.



# Mini Cozy Plant



I added a few extras dots of water to the Sage icing color to have a little flow to the icing so that the 'leaves' had a rounder smoother look. I used a tip #1.5 to add these details. I added the leaves using a teardrop shape of icing. I found that some of the plant stems did overlap. Therefore, I started with the 'stems' on the outside and worked my way in so that the center stem would be on top.



# MINI Open Book



Reduce and eliminate craters and cracks in small icing areas by adding a little piping icing in those areas before flooding (like the heart). This structure underneath will keep that icing smooth and puffed up.
