Canada Moose	7 days	\$ 12,500	1-on-1 basis. From mi-September through mid-October.
Black Bear ⁽¹⁾	6 days	\$ 5,500	Over bait. Camp runs 5 hunts from end of April through the beginning of June. Max 6 hunters at a time.
Combo Black Bear/Moose ⁽²⁾	7 days	\$ 17,500	1-on-1 basis. Real opportunity to also harvest a Wolf. From mi-September through mid-October.
Archery Whitetail or Mule Deer	6 days	\$ 5,500	2-to-1 basis. First hunt starts September 1 st (velvet). Only 2 hunts / year. Max 4 hunters / year.
Combo Archery Whitetail and Mule Deer(2)	8 days	\$ 7,000	2-to-1 basis. First hunt starts September 1 st (velvet). Only 2 hunts / year. Max 2 hunters / year.
Rut (Rifle) Whitetail or Mule Deer	6 days	\$ 6,000	2-to-1 basis. First hunt starts November 8 th . Only 3 hunts / year. Max 6 hunters / year.
Combo Rut (Rifle) Whitetail and Mule Deer(2)	8 days	\$ 7,500	2-to-1 basis. First hunt starts November 8 th . Only 2 hunts / year. Max 4 hunters / year.
Timber Wolf	7 days	\$ 5,500	Winter hunts from December through the end of February. Dates and duration are flexible.

- Federal Goods and Services Tax (GST) is not included in the above price list (rate as of January 1st is 5%)
- Government Licence fee to be paid by the license holder upon arrival in Canada at a licensed store. 2023 licence fees are provided for info only (The 5% Federal Goods and Services Tax is not included):

Wildlife Certificate: CAD68.22

Bowhunting permit: CAD23.20 (not required for rifle or crossbow)

Moose: CAD310.30 Whitetail or Mule Deer License: CAD203.84

Black Bear: CAD105.20 (this licence is valid for 2 black bears)

Wolf/Coyotes: CAD12.40

- Prior to purchasing any licence, each hunter must possess a valid Wildlife Identification Number (WIN). Activation cost of the WIN card is CAD8.00

Practical Information

Species	Type of hunt	Expected Shooting Distance
Moose	Spike camp. Calling them in during the rut. Spot & Stalk or elevated stand.	50 to 250 yards.
Black Bear	Spike camp. Tree stands over bait. Afternoon/evening hunt only during the spring.	15 to 35 yards.
Whitetail	Hunting cabin. Stand (tripod or tree stand) or heated blind if too cold to be in a stand.	Rifle: between 100 and 200 yards in average but up to 600 yards occasionally. Archery: 60 yards.
Mule Deer	Hunting cabin. Spot & Stalk mainly and occasionally from tree stand.	Rifle: Very rarely above 250 yards. Archery: 20 to 60 yards.
Wolf	Hunting cabin. Heated blind over bait	Most of the baits are setup 200 yards from the blind.

Included in All our hunts:

- Airport Transfer (except moose hunts meet at staging area).
- Transportation while hunting.
- All meals and snacks.
- Lodging at our cabin or in outfitter's tent while hunting.
- Professionally preparation of the trophy to travel back home.

What the price does NOT include:

- Return Airfare to/from Home-Airport or staging area.
- En-route hotel costs.
- Alcoholic and soda drinks.
- Federal Goods and Services Tax (GST)
- Government Licence Fee.
- Gratuities to guides and staff.

Terms and Conditions:

- 50% down payment non-refundable at the time of booking.
- 50% at least 60 days prior to flying in day, otherwise hunt is cancelled with no refund.
- License cost is extra and to be paid directly to the retailer upon arrival to Canada.
- A hunt contract and liability form must be filled out and submitted with the deposit (no exceptions).
- Hunters wishing to leave early will be charged \$100 US per person to cover fuel expenses (except moose hunts).
- Hunter's tag is void on first blood.

Must Know for Archery hunters

We are Not allowing mechanical broadheads in our hunts. We recommend a fixed blade that weighs 125 grains. Arrows must weigh a combined weight of 400 grains, by regulation.

Persons hunting big game in Alberta must use an authorized bow and an authorized arrow. An authorized bow is one that is held, drawn and released by muscular power and has a draw weight of not less than 18 kg (40 lb.). This is the number of kilograms (pounds) required to draw an arrow of 71 cm (28 in.) to its head. An authorized arrow is one that is not less than 61 cm (24 in.) in length that has a tip that bears a head that is not intentionally designed to resist being withdrawn after it has penetrated an object. Furthermore, it must either have a solid, sharp cutting head of at least 7/8 inch in width, or a head that, when the arrow impacts, opens to present sharp cutting edges at least 7/8 inch in width.

Must Know for Cross-bows hunters

Cross-bows may not be used to hunt big game during archery-only seasons.

Persons hunting big game with a cross-bow must use an authorized cross-bow and arrow (bolt). An authorized cross-bow is one that requires 100 pounds or more of pull to draw the string or cable to its cocked position. There is no restriction on arrow length, however it must have a tip that bears a head that is not intentionally designed to resist being withdrawn after it has penetrated an object. Furthermore, it must either have a solid, sharp cutting head of at least 7/8 inch in width, or a head that, when the arrow impacts, opens to present sharp cutting edges at least 7/8 inch in width.

Our Hunting Cabins and Territory

The following big games are hunted out of our hunting cabins:

- Whitetail Deer
- Mule Deer
- Timber Wolf
- Coyote



Our hunts take place in Wildlife Management Units (WMU) 322, 330 and 332 which extend more than 50 miles west of the town of Rimbey, Alberta, Canada.

- Our hunting lodge is located 20 miles west of the town of Rimbey, in the middle of the hunting area.
- Our lodge is modest, rustic and comfortable even during our cold Canadian Winter.
- Connected to the grid, propane gas heaters and hot water, wood stove, Wi-fi and hot tub.

- In September, expect warm temperatures during the day (70 to 80 Fahrenheit) dropping quickly to 50 to 60 F by sunset. Could be below 50 F when walking to the stand early morning.
- Mosquitos are fading by mid-August but some will make it through to early September.
- By November, the temperatures will drop below 30 F and the ground will be covered in snow.
- Part of the hunting area is bush country, and as wild as it can get. You will spot coyotes, moose and maybe elks. And, you may encounter brown bears, cougars, Canada lynx and wolves.


Our Spike camp is located north of Fort MacKay, Alberta, in WMU 531.

Hunters fly to Fort MacMurray (YMM) where they get either picked up by truck or to fly by helicopter to camp.

The camp is setup with:

- a 12' x 20' wall tent kitchen
- Cabela's 12' x 12' outfitters tents (2 hunters per tent)
- all tents have a wood stove
- a shower
- an outhouse
- a skinning and salting tent
- a gas-powered generator
- a charging station for your electronics



The hunting territory is in the boreal forest, composed essentially of conifers, swamps and bogs. It is not uncommon to observe the northern lights from camp. This is as wild as it can get with a very healthy population of Wolves, Wood Buffalos, and Mooses whom travel back in forth between our hunting territory and the Wood Buffalo National Park.

The Wood Buffalo National Park is the largest national park of Canada (17,275 sq mi). It extends from the north-east part of Alberta to the southern part of the Northwest Territories. It is the second-largest national park in the world.
