

Battle Creek Watershed

FISHING OPPORTUNITY IN THE Battle Creek watershed is limited. Frequent low flows and warm water temperatures restrict trout populations in

Battle Creek. Fishing is maintained with stocking. Smaller tributaries in the upper reaches of the watershed such as Pine Creek, Grizzly Bear, and Iron Creek (South) have thriving populations of brook trout. Be prepared to fish small streams which require short, precise casts with ultra-light tackle or 7-foot, 2 to 4 weight fly rods.

Iron Creek is primarily a brook trout fishery. Numerous beaver dams are found in Iron Creek upstream from Lakota Lake. Lakota Lake is stocked with rainbow trout.

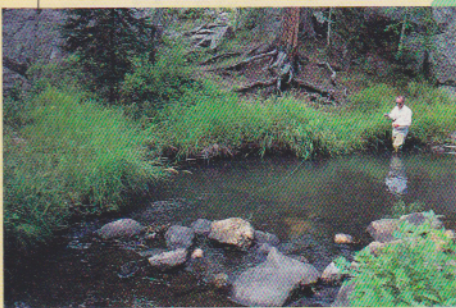
